From the Dean's Pen ...

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Alleluia! Amen.

"Alleluia!" Feels so liberating to say this word again! Our fasting and Season of Lent is over. Easter is with us. And our hope and faith are strengthened and elevated with this time of Spring, warmer weather, and more folks getting vaccinated. Our hope is also for less positivity, hospitalizations, and deaths, as well as control of the variants now spreading throughout the country. I personally am excited and optimistic about the near future, but at the same time I am desiring to be cautious, and for us to be safe.

A few things to share with you:

First, our Holy Week and Easter Day schedule.

Easter Sunday, April 4 - 11:00 AM Zoom Service: "Resurrection of our Lord." Bishop Waggoner will be present by Zoom and will be preaching.

Second, I wish to remind everyone that the Vestry and a Committee for Re-opening has been working diligently with plans that continue to evolve as science and medical information changes. If guidelines, such as vaccines completed and wearing masks continues, and certification can be developed for a reasonable and healthy use of the Parish Hall, we will do so and submit it to the Diocesan Standing Committee for approval. This likely may not be a reality for us prior to June. The Cathedral space will not be ready for

Preparing a Grief Basket

A young friend of mine recently told me that the mother of her friend Clara (not her real name) had recently signed up for hospice care. My friend told me that she wanted to prepare a Grief Basket for Clara to give her when her mother died. We discussed what items to put in the basket. Flowers, cut ones, to give joy right away. Potted ones, that will produce joy after joy. Seeds to be planted, because playing in the dirt can be so healing when "earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust" have been pronounced over the body of a loved one. Then, because grief does not sit just in your heart or your head, but in every cell of your body, a gift certificate for a massage, some body lotion, bath salts, lavender soaps. Boxes of tissues to encourage the tears. Some nourishing foods, because a grieving body still needs to eat. Something to encourage laughter because laughing in the face of death says to death that it does not win; it does not hold the trump card. We discussed books and settled on Alla Renee Bozarth's *A Journey Through Grief* (ISBN 1-56838-037-2). It is a small book, with sound advice about grieving and contains some poetry as well. (Granger Westberg's *Good Grief* came in a close second.) Most importantly of all, a note promising to listen to the death story and the chronicles of grief and heartache, no matter how many times they need to be told; a promise not be afraid of the grief; a promise to rejoice in the signs of new life which in time will bubble up.



In all my years as a hospice chaplain and bereavement coordinator, I never thought of creating a grief basket, so I am sharing the idea with you because you may have someone in your life who could use such a basket, especially now in this Covid time. You yourself may need such a basket, either because you have lost a loved one or because the corporate grief which has been visited upon us is welling up all around. By the time you read this, we will be in Holy Week, or maybe already at Easter. Christians who attend to the liturgies of Holy Week know that Easter's power would not be there without the story of the death of Jesus. So too, we emerge from all our losses and griefs not by avoiding them, trying to go around them as it were, but by going through them. Jesus spent time in the tomb. Grieving is our tomb time, a place to heal and ready ourselves for the new life which will surely come.

April 11: Thomas Believes

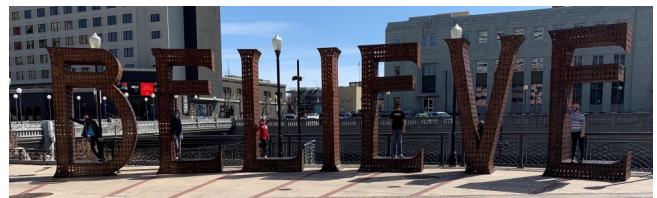

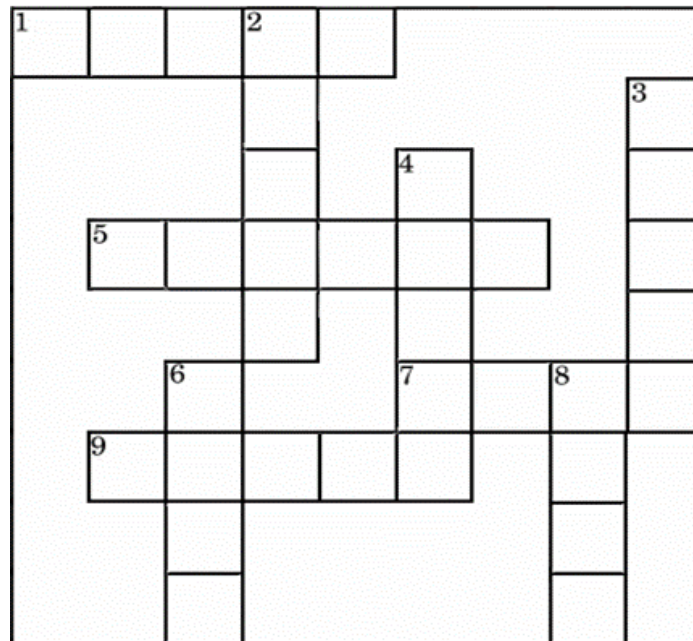

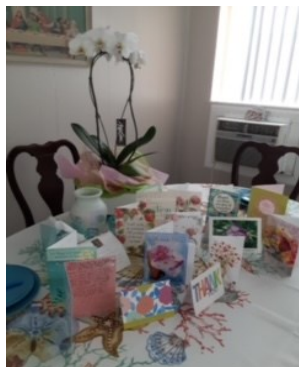

ST. PAUL'S FOOD PANTRY

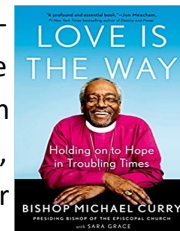

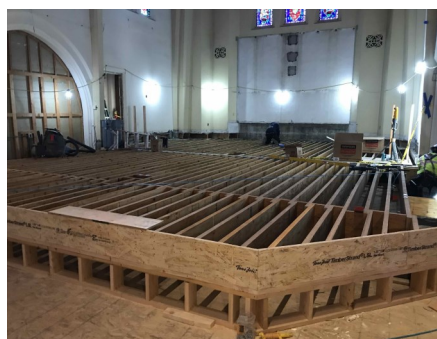
Want to Join Bible and Books?

Cathedral Renovation Update

The renovation work in the Cathedral is moving along as planned and on schedule. Currently the Nave and Chancel areas are full of scaffolding from floor to ceiling. This is necessary for the installation of lighting fixtures, fire suppression system, and cleaning the ceiling and trusses. Two new restrooms, one of which is ADA compliant, are being added to the first floor. The former multilayer chancel area is now one single space. The floor in the Bishop Lewis Chapel also has been modified to be one level.

We anticipate completion of the renovation by mid to late August. At that time, our magnificent pipe organ will be returned for installation. Currently, repairs are being made to a number of the organ's façade pipes which had begun to collapse around the mouth openings. The console will be on a dolly allowing the capability to move the console for better viewing during concerts. In addition, technological upgrades are being made to the console that will enhance performance capabilities.

We look forward to the opportunity of worshipping together again as more of us receive vaccinations and as the renovation work moves closer to completion.

Vestry Minutes Summary, March 23, 2021

Financial Report



Vestry Notes

The meeting was conducted by Zoom Meeting and opened with prayer at 6:10 PM followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and sharing of individual blessings. The agenda was amended, and minutes of the February 23, 2021 meeting were approved. **Financial Matters:** David Morgan, Treasurer, reviewed the financial statements for the month of February and commented we are holding steady. David also reported the Endowment Fund now has exceeded the goal of \$1 million in the fund. Terry Cain, Junior Warden, commented on a letter sent to the Diocese related to the Cathedral's decision regarding the diocesan assessment. Vestry approved an overall budget recommended by the Finance and Administration Committee for the Cathedral building renovation in the amount of \$2,538,192. Vestry approved moving several restricted funds, subject to donor approval, to the Capital Project fund. **Committee Reports:** Terry reported the Property Committee is examining security issues to evaluate the Cathedral property and its security. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, reported on the activities of the Building Renovation Committee. He commented the Cathedral renovation completion is anticipated for the latter part of August after which the Cathedral pipe organ will be reinstalled. Father William reported the Facilities Reopening Committee is working on establishing protocols and procedures for reopening during the Covid pandemic. **Dean's Report:** Father William reported on deaths and funerals and noted many memorials being postponed until we are open

again for worship. He commented the Zoom formats for Sunday and Thursday worship have been well received. He reported on planning for Holy Week services. Bishop Jim Waggoner will preach for both the Vigil service on Saturday evening and the Easter Sunday 11 AM Mass. **Old Business:** Vestry approved the revised Cathedral Lay Employee Handbook. Vestry also approved revisions to the Cathedral's vacation, sick, and holiday policies to be consistent with language in the handbook. Father William reported the decision by the Orvis Foundation on the Cathedral's funding request is delayed by a month. Vestry agreed to schedule a Zoom retreat with Bishop Waggoner from 9 AM to 12 PM on April 24, 2021. Father William reported the Northwest Mission District will have a Zoom meeting on Saturday, April 17, 2021 from 10 AM to 11:30 AM All Trinity convention delegates should plan to attend this meeting. Father William and Howard Bennett commented on the activities of Nevadans for the Common Good. Father William reported a Ministry Review Committee has been established consisting of the Senior and Junior wardens, Carolyn Hoffmann as a vestry representative, and Robert Andrade as a lay representative. Vestry approved appointments to 2021 committees and noted needed recruitment for open positions on some committees. Father William noted a convention delegate position is open since Terry Cain will be attending as Junior Warden. One of the alternate delegates will be selected to fill the position. The meeting adjourned at 8:18 PM. The next meeting of the Vestry is scheduled for Tuesday, April 20, 2021 as a Zoom meeting at 6 PM.
