Got A Phone?

You may be sick of me continually rattling on about Zoom meetings, but I have a new idea to share, so please humor me. Most of you know that in these Covid times, Zoom is all the rage as we try to work from home, conduct church business, teach Bible classes and Sunday School, lead EYC (Episcopal Youth Community) meetings and grief support groups, and connect with family and friends. We all long for the days when we can meet in person, but for now this is what we have, and I must say that when ever I'm in a Zoom meeting I am grateful that we can see and talk without wearing masks, knowing that each of us is in a safe place, with no physical distancing needed!



Not everyone has a computer or the internet, of course, and that leaves many of you feeling like you are out of the loop when it comes to participating in this new world of Zoom. However, if you own a phone, you can get on Zoom meetings, no internet or computer needed. For meetings hosted by the Trinity staff, once you have decided which Zoom meeting you want to attend, call us at the church to get the meeting ID number and the passcode. When it is time for your meeting to start, you call the number for our area which is 1-669-900-9128. You will be prompted to put in the meeting ID number and hit #; then you will be asked to enter the participant ID number, but ignore that and hit # again; then the passcode number goes in, # again, and bingo, you're in the meeting. You will not be able to see the other participants, nor they you, but you will be able to hear the conversation and join in. These instructions are for regular phones. If you have a smart phone, it's a little different, and we can help you with that, but again, no computer or home internet connection is needed.

During Advent our Wednesday evenings will be conducted on Zoom, so I hope you will give this a try, as well as considering some of our many other programs (all described somewhere else in this newsletter). We miss you and want to spend some time with you. As always, call if you have questions or need some encouragement. We can walk you through the process.

A Stewardship message from Lynne Charlat, Junior Warden

Together with our Campaign Co-Chairs, I humbly offer a heartfelt thank you to all our parishioners who have returned their pledge for the 2021 "Here I am Lord" Stewardship Campaign. As of the first of December, we have received pledges from 171 households in the amount of \$433,321. We acknowledge we are not where we need to be for 2021 to fully support our staff and programming at current levels. Last year's budget was built upon the gifts of 226 households representing \$610,000 in pledges, as well as open plate and other non-pledge income. That form of additional giving is now more limited due to our inability to gather and worship in person. As we embrace Advent, the season of hope, we are confident in our ability to emerge from these difficult days filled with love, renewed in strength, and with our hands ready to engage in and carry out Trinity's mission and ministry into the future. To do that we must be like the proverbial chain, and we need each link in our chain to be committed to our collective future. Your pledge in this time could not be more critical.

Terry Cain and Lindsay Campbell, our Stewardship Campaign Co-Chairs, have worked extremely hard to present a wonderful stewardship campaign for us this year. You received their literature and hopefully have watched the stewardship campaign videos posted on our website at www.trinityreno.org. We have a dedicated and committed staff working exceeding hard to help us be the church in the world and sustain us individually and corporately until we are able to gather again. We are counting on each one of us who has not yet completed and returned their 2021 pledge in support of our Cathedral's mission and ministries to place their link into our chain to help us attain the financial support we need for 2021 to be the vibrant parish we are.

May our spirits be filled with the hope and joy of Christ's coming.

Sanctuary Renovation

It seems only fitting that on the cusp of Advent, a time of celebration and anticipation, your vestry unanimously approved the cost and plan for the renovation of our cathedral. Construction is slated to begin in early January with an anticipated completion date in early August. This significant milestone caps several months of intensive work and review.

Our Journey:

Your generous gifts to our Faith Like A River campaign are now giving rise to the first phase of improving the cathedral's accessibility and creating a more welcoming sanctuary. While our initial schedule envisioned beginning construction by the first of July, an unexpected factor impacted this ambitious plan. The initial construction bid to complete the work, as originally conceived prior to the formation of the Construction Committee, was far higher than expected, primarily driven by a state-of- the-art, but ultimately unaffordable, air conditioning system. In addition, the careful removal of our



Cassavant organ for safe keeping revealed perilous metal fatigue in many of the façade pipes which are now being repaired. The substantial cost of removing, storing, and making needed repairs to the organ was not fully understood or anticipated.

Over the past several months, members of the Cathedral's Construction Committee, assisted by the Finance, Facilities, and Administration Committee, closely examined every aspect of the project design and every line of the bid. We worked with our architect and team at Dianda Construction, now Plenium Builders, to bring the scope of the project back to within our project budget while retaining the twin objectives of accessibility and welcome.

We are now ready to begin anew:

Identifying "must-have" components and prioritizing "nice-to-have" options so we can move forward within budget has been successfully achieved: the original proposed construction bid was more than \$2.9 million. The Committees identified and agreed upon cost savings of approximately \$968,000. Taking into account costs related to construction and architecture, the final overall renovation budget is just under \$2 million. Bringing our beloved organ home is expected to cost at least an additional \$100,000. The redesign of our cooling system allows the schedule for completing this phase to be compressed from more than 12 months to seven months. Permits have already been issued by the city, and Plenium Builders (formerly known as Dianda Construction) is now poised to move forward.

While we didn't expect to push the pause button, this intensive review of the design and costs has ensured good stewardship of your campaign pledges and donations entrusted to us, and this will continue throughout the entire project. I am grateful for the patience and generosity of our Trinity family as well as the commitment and tenacity of our two leadership committees as we have successfully worked through our challenges to bring us to this day of celebration in our season of anticipation of the coming of the Christ child.

How Firm a Foundation

Dear Trinity, I have been on a "deep dive" into our parish history through photos and documents. As you know, there are important photos lining our office hallway, and many are easily viewed on our Facebook page. I'm so grateful to long-time members like Debbie Zalmana and others who've taken time to share stories and fill in some missing pieces for me. As a new member of the Trinity family it's very important for me to put our church into proper historical context as we approach our 150th anniversary. What's very clear to me is we have a rich legacy and a strong foundation laid by the saints who've come before us. We must never forget that our physical building stands as a testament to their faith in God even through two major floods! Equally important is their trust that we will carry the torch for future generations. I've also learned that the need for our work in Reno and beyond has never been greater. So we must be vigilant, "press toward the mark of our high calling," and not allow our current challenges to keep us from being the church.

On Sunday, Canon Ruth mentioned the need to "suss out" the Gospel in the series of bleak readings that ended the church year. And, let's face it, 2020 has also presented us with unimaginable challenges. How do people of faith respond? Where do we find an encouraging word to help us persevere? As your music minister, I suggest the hymns of our faith are second only to scripture as a pillar of support in times of grief, uncertainty and despair. So, as we approach the first Sunday of Advent, the day of Hope, ponder these words carefully and let them take deep root in your heart.

- 3. When through the deep waters I call thee to go the rivers of woe shall not thee overflow; for I will be near thee, thy troubles to bless, And sanctify to thee thy deepest distress.
- 4. The soul that on Jesus still leans for repose,
 I will not, I will not desert to its foes;
 that soul, though all hell should endeavor to shake
 I'll never, no never, no never forsake!

Stewardship Pledges Update

Thanks to those who have returned their 2021 pledges for the "Here I am Lord" steward-ship campaign before the requested deadline! As of the first of December, we have received 152 pledges totaling more than \$403,200 unfortunately, this is short of our 2021 goal of \$780,000. However, it is not too late, and we hope that additional pledges will be made before the vestry needs to adopt a 2021 budget. For comparison, last year we re-



ceived a total of 226 pledges. If parishioners who pledged last year but not yet this year made similar pledges in the coming days, we would approach our goal. If additional parishioners pledged, we could exceed it!

Episodes feature Trinity parishioners discussing just a small sample of our compassionate service, healing, and outreach ministries. Stewardship pledges support these activities and so much more.



Kids Corner

The first part of the Sunday school year has been a learning experience for all of us. We have learned to adjust and come together to continue bringing the gospel to our children. We now enter the Advent and Christmas season with its themes of hope, love, joy, and peace. Maya Angelou states:

"look heavenward and speak the word aloud.

Peace. We look at our world and speak the word aloud.

Peace. We look at each other, then into ourselves,

And we say without shyness or hesitation:

Peace, my Brother. Peace, my Sister, Peace, My Soul."



I deeply appreciate our students, parents, teachers, and mentors who help to make Sunday School and Youth programs meaningful for all.

Here's a recap of the Godly Play Stories we studied this Fall and the ideas we explored:

From the story of Noah's Ark: Noah was told by God to build an ark and God gave him instructions to follow. Explore what you might have thought if God asked you to build a boat.

From the story of Abraham and Sarah: This was a story about God keeping promises. Have you ever made a promise to a friend or to your parents? How did you feel?

From the story of Samuel: Eli taught Samuel about God. Who helps to teach you about God?

From the story of King David: Remember that God is with you just as God was with the people we have explored so far this year.

Angel Tree Project

The members of the Order of the Daughters of the King are pleased to report that in spite of the need to protect everyone from exposure to the COVID 19 virus, with the support of the clergy and the vestry, we were able to devise an all-email method of communication with our parishioners. We had a total of 114

Angels to be adopted at Stead Elementary School, each representing a needy child. 73 were adopted by parishioners who bought gifts for them and delivered those to Trinity. Many other parishioners donated money to be used to shop for the remaining children, and that also was accomplished. Thank you, Internet!

We thank Father William and Molly so much for being our back up when one of us was not physically present at the church. Trinity is fortunate to have such a dedicated team!

Thank you to everyone for stepping up to help us to make this a blessed Christmas for the less fortunate.

Vestry Report Financial Report

Vestry Summary, November 23, 2020



The meeting was conducted by video conference and opened with prayer at 6:15 p.m. followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and individual blessings. The agenda (with adjustments), minutes of the October 19,



2020 Vestry meeting, and October Financial Report were approved or accepted.

Treasurer report: David Morgan reported the "bottom line" is approximately where it was expected to be. Revenue is down but expenses also are down which keeps the budget on target. He also reported the capital campaign accounts are healthy. Terry Cain provided an update on the Stewardship 2020 Pledge Campaign. As of November 15, there were 141 pledges received totaling approximately \$377,901, including 24 pledges from individuals who had not previously pledged. Finance, Facilities, and Administration Committee Report: Lynne Charlat, Junior Warden, reviewed possible increases in the insurance coverage for crime coverage. She reported the Budget Committee will meet on December 8 to prepare draft of a proposed budget. On recommendation of the committee, the Vestry approved awarding the contract to Plenium Builders for the Cathedral renovation project at a Guaranteed Maximum Price of \$1,945,990. Renovation work is anticipated to begin in early January. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, reported on the progress of development of a revised Employee Handbook. The Vestry approved policies related to holidays, vacation, and sick leave. Lynne Charlat provided a brief update on the website improvements. Ministry Reports: Father William reported the Cathedral stopped food drop-offs for St. Paul's Food Pantry Due to the increase in COVID-19 numbers. Monetary donations are encouraged. He reported the Daughters of the King received all the donated, wrapped gifts for the Angel Tree Project. These gifts will be delivered to Stead Elementary school for distribution. Dean's Report: Father William reported on several activities including developing a midweek Advent program, dates for prerecording several holiday services, developing the 2021 calendar, postponement of the General Convention, a joint Mission District "Lessons and Carol's" posting, Cathedral receipt of historic status, and distribution of discretionary funds. Canon for Parish Life: Rev. Ruth reported on reaching out to those impacted by the Pinehaven Fire. She also commented on various groups meeting for Bible study and grief. EYC and JYC had eight participants at the last Sunday gathering. Vestry: Father William commended Vestry members for continuing to contact parishioners. Kait Flocchini reported the Nominating Committee will present a proposed slate at the December Vestry meeting. Administration: Conven-



tion Delegates reported on the recent meeting to approve a budget for the diocese for 2021. **Old Business**: Margaret Zuccarini reported on the draft reopening plan developed in cooperation with the Mission District. The meeting adjourned at 9:32 PM. The next meeting is December 21, 2020 at 6 PM.
