From the Dean's Pen ...

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

It is hard to believe that shortly we will be into the Season of Lent beginning with Ash Wednesday, February 17th. As we look to this time of year, we anticipate the signs of Spring with life and renewal (though right now with the cold and snow accumulation, this may be a stretch of the imagination!). This a time of hope and inspiration as we approach Easter.

As a liturgical Church, Lent is a time in which we are expected to make some changes to our worship Services with Lent. As a part of this change of seasons we are also going to be introducing a new format for recording and participating in worship beginning in March. Rather than live-stream, record and post our services, we are looking to a Zoom platform where we can “see one another.” This service will be still be recorded and posted, but in the process of “doing worship” we will be more “present” to each other and see one another, and share some of the worship work (like having a rotation of readers). More information will come forth as we progress through February.

There are definite changes in the liturgy which are typical for us with Lent. This penitential season requires a simpler liturgy to be more contemplative, allowing more room for silence and reflection. An expanded act of Confession will mark the beginning of our worship. The “Alleluias” are eliminated as we

refrain from exuberance and rejoicing, reserving it for the Easter Season starting with the Easter Vigil. Because of the pandemic, this year our liturgy will place us into a Communion Fast. We will not be observing a Eucharist, rather we will participate in a service based on listening to and praying God’s Word in scripture, preaching, prayer and song. This is the season where it is most appropriate to practice a Communion Fast. This will enable us to appreciate what the Eucharist is and means, as we also encourage you to take up another discipline such as alms giving, fasting, Bible study and/or reading, and daily prayer. Other changes are in posture, where kneeling and sitting is encouraged, as well as minimizing music and hymnody and adding periods of silence for reflection.



Since many of you continue to be home and are at home with our worship time, we ask you to relish times for silence not only in your home environment, but also in our liturgy. It is important to create an environment of solitude and quiet around you as we worship together virtually. A moment of quiet may be unfamiliar and even uncomfortable because there are few times in our busy lives when we truly experience silence. There is no right or wrong way to act in silence; primarily this is a time to simply sit and be still. You may want to focus on your breathing or listen to the different sounds around you; the murmur of voices, the sound of footsteps, the birds

"You Are Not Alone" Support Group is Restarting

Some of you may remember the "You Are Not Alone" support group for people who have severe or chronic illnesses. The group, led by Rev. Rick Milsap, met monthly for five years, but was interrupted by Covid before Rev. Rick could appoint a successor facilitator to continue the group after his retirement. (The 2020 annual report incorrectly stated that the group was disbanded. That is not so, and we regret the error.) However, recent conversations have indicated that there is interest in restarting, so that is what we'll do, continuing with the old schedule, 4:00 p.m. on the third Tuesday of each month. For now, however, all meetings will be on Zoom and will be hosted by me. Members of Trinity and others in the community who have severe or chronic illnesses are welcome to join us. Even if you do not have such an illness, you may know others who do and who could benefit from this group, and since it is Zoom, time zones and state lines are not prohibitive for participation.



Like most support groups "You Are Not Alone" requires participants to listen well to one another and maintain confidentiality. In return, attendees find that they indeed are not alone in their feelings around the diseases and conditions they are experiencing. Over time they discover a community where before there was none. I am eager to get started. Let me know of your or others interest at revruth@trinityreno.org.

Music Notes from Dr. Gordon

HAPPY NEW YEAR CHOIR ZOOM



On January 14 members of the choir celebrated the arrival of 2021 with a time of fellowship and care. It was a wonderful time of sharing health concerns, joys, hopes, and dreams, and helpful ideas for meaningful worship. We are reviving the “Virtual Choir” project and look forward to sharing our progress with you in a few weeks.

At this time last year, I was directing one of the choirs at Texas Woman’s University. All of the choirs were looking forward to an end-of-semester concert celebrating the centennial of women’s suffrage, by the ratification of the 19th Amendment. So, when choosing a repertoire for the semester, I included several prominent female composers. However, I also included “Keep Your Eyes on the Prize”, an important Civil Rights Movement protest song, which served as a springboard for dialogue and a musical bridge to the past. Although TWU is now a co-ed institution, and there is a fantastic mixed-voice choir (SATB), my ensemble was a strictly treble-voice choir (SSAA). It was my first time as primary director for an adult women’s chorus. I was overjoyed by the energy and talent these college students brought to our rehearsals and performances. Concurrently, I was challenged to grow in my understanding of “gender equality” and the fact that

several of my students did not identify as female. “Dr. Gordon, can I wear a tuxedo instead of a gown for the concert?” “Absolutely!” I responded. I feel fortunate to have served an institution committed to creating an environment where all gender identities and orientations feel welcomed and affirmed.

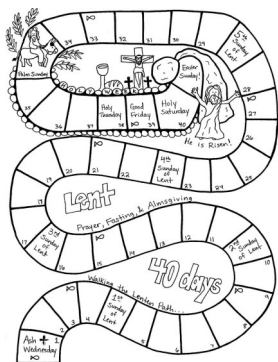
As we begin Black History Month, I’m not thinking about the countless ways African Americans have contributed to our world. Rather, in light of the prominent place white supremacy has dreadfully gained in our mainstream society, and the passage of new laws seeking to provide every hindrance to voting rights, I am focused on how much work needs to be done. As an African-American male and a disciple of Christ, what shall I do? As a new member in this community, how can I join you as a witness for Christ in such a divisive time? How can we make our earthly realm mirror the realm of heaven? Will we tackle the issues of race and equality with the same admirable zeal with which we feed the hungry? These are questions I’ll be sorting out prayerfully over the coming days. I hope you’ll join me in both prayer and conversations. And, may our journey through Lent embolden us to “Do justly, love mercy and walk humbly with God”.

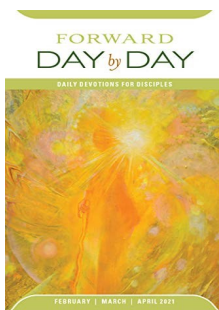

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE A PART OF THE CIRCLE OF FRIENDS?

Circle of Friends is a group of about ten people who commit to daily check-in phone calls with each other. This is how it works: You are given one name to call. You call this person, usually in the morning, but anytime is okay, to check in on them—how they are, what's going on for the day, etc. If for some reason you can't reach your person, there's a system in place to do a further check. In turn, you also receive a phone call from someone who checks in with you. Every so often, the leader of the group switches the names around, so you have a "new" person to call and you have a "new" person checking in with you.

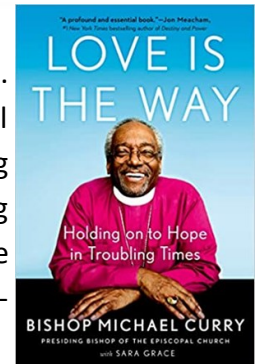

The 2020 Annual Meeting - January 31, 2021

We marked a historic moment on Sunday, January 31st with our Annual Meeting!

- It was our very first virtual (Zoom) Annual Meeting!
- It was the first time we were deprived of what we enjoy doing best – eating and socializing. But we got to “see” one another!
- We had at least 72 individual parties log in to the meeting – which meant we had an awesome gathering of members!

Our Annual Report captured the breadth and depth of our ministries of the past year. We are most grateful to all the leaders of ministries and programs, who submitted reports offering insights into the work we do in the name of Christ. A common theme was that many programs had to be re-thought and re-created to conform to the demands of the coronavirus state-wide and county wide rules for protection with social distancing and isolation. We have learned in a new and creative way to “be Church.” So many of our members and leaders have stepped up to the challenge with optimism and positivity and enormous attitudes of hope. Indeed, together we will and are seeing this through.

Our meeting had a report from Father William on the “State of the Parish” that revealed the challenge of bringing on a new staff during a pandemic where we are not able to be truly meet and get to know one another. The collective commitment, enthusiasm, and hopefulness continues to strengthen us as a Christian community as we begin to see a way through these challenges. We are especially optimistic that as we are able to have gatherings again with worship, knowing that as we move down the road there is a renewed and renovated worship space waiting for us.



The Annual Dean's Award, the triquetra pin, for outstanding servant work among us, went to two individuals. Carmen Lopez was honored for her years of service as our live-in sexton. She will be sorely missed, and we are grateful that she and the grandchildren will be among us when we re-open. And second, Jim Lamb, our Senior Warden honored for his immense work with the innumerable projects were tended to this past year which are too many to list. His humility, wisdom, patience, and bridge-building skills are greatly appreciated.

Vestry Summary, January 18, 2021



Vestry Notes

The meeting was conducted by Zoom Meeting conference and opened with prayer at 6:05 p.m. followed by a reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and individual blessings. The agenda and minutes of the December 21, 2020 Vestry meeting were approved.

Treasurer report: Treasurer David Morgan reviewed December 2020 financial statements noting a generous contribution of \$50,000 from a parishioner to cover current budget deficit. He also acknowledged a \$10,000 contribution from the same parishioner for the Sack Lunch program as well as an additional \$1,000 from another parishioner for Sack Lunch. David reported 99% of 2020 pledges have been paid. Faith Like a River Capital Campaign received several substantial year-end contributions. **Ministry Reports:** Terry Cain reported the 2021 stewardship campaign received \$503,000 from 211 pledgers. **Finance, Facilities, and Administration Committee:** Lynne Charlat, Junior Warden, reported the renovation project is moving forward "at a fast pace." Vestry discussed 2021 budget, which unanimously was approved subsequently by email ballot. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, noted status on the lay employee handbook and background check process. **Property**

Committee: It was reported that items not planned for return to Cathedral building have been donated.

Dean's Report: Father William commented on the graveside service for Rosevinia Bautista Sanchez on January 12. He also commented on the completion of the Annual Report for 2020.

Vestry: Father William emphasized reaching out to parishioners. Clergy are exploring other options for services to increase engagement. Father William noted the Diocese Convention is scheduled for October 2021 in Ely, NV. Trinity is allowed 10 voting delegates plus senior and junior wardens along with five alternate delegates. A slate of delegates and alternates will be presented for approval at Trinity's Annual Meeting on January 31. **Administration:** Father William reminded that the Parish Annual Meeting will take place at 12:30 p.m. on January 31, 2021 via Zoom.

Old Business: Margaret Zuccarini commented the Quincentennial Celebration Committee needs to be revived. Further consideration will be discussed at Vestry's February 2021 meeting. The meeting adjourned at 8:22 p.m. The next Vestry meeting is scheduled for February 22, 2021.
