Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

We have come through the Easter Season, celebrated Pentecost and Trinity Sunday, and now move into what we generally refer to as “Ordinary Time.” These are Sundays focused on the teachings of Jesus, challenging us to grow in our faith and life applications. All of this has enhanced our excitement as we move ahead out of the darkness of the past 15 months with the pandemic. To even have a morsel of in-person worship with Eucharist has restored life and vigor for many. Some thoughts on Memorial Day

As you read this we have just celebrated Memorial Day, which when I was a child was always celebrated on May 30. Now it's the last Monday of May, presumably, I think, so that we can have a three-day weekend. The holiday was first known as Decoration Day, and was created for families to remember their Civil War dead. My family had no Civil War dead since our forebears had immigrated after the 1860s, nevertheless we observed "Decoration Day," as my grandmother Hanusa continued to call it, with a family ritual which we never missed. Grandma had enormous peony bushes in her yard. The flowers were enormous too, and each year on Decoration Day, she would cut vast quantities of the blooms, put them in water-filled Mason jars, pack them carefully in a cardboard box and load them in the back of a family pick-up. Then several generations of Hanusas would drive to Walnut Hill Cemetery and place a jar of peonies at the gravesite of each of our family members, even though none of them had died in any military conflict. Most of those folks had died before I was born, but I remember those trips as we honored and remembered those who had gone before us.



I miss that tradition. Nowadays, not only has the day changed, but so has the focus. Somewhere along the line Memorial Day has become a second Veterans' Day. Now, I'm not anti-military (my two sons have served) nor am I unpatriotic, but why have two Veterans' Days each year? Especially since it means that we no longer take a day to honor and remember our familial loved ones who have died. Maybe it's because, with more cremations, there are fewer graves where jars of flowers can be placed. I don't know, but I have a sneaking suspicion that it's because many Americans have turned aside from tending to their grief.

My years of hospice chaplaincy and bereavement work taught me how quickly many modern Americans want to move on from their grief, clean out the belongings, get over it, return to normal. It doesn't work so well. Close family and friends who have shared our lives with us will never be forgotten by us; the grief never truly goes away, even though over time it hurts less. Genuine engagement with the grief process takes time and eventually yields a sense of acceptance, peace and the awareness that everything in life is just for a little while. We need to remember those who have died in our lifetime, but also those who lived and died long before, for all of them are family. We need to remember their contributions to our lives, just as we hope to be remembered by those who come after us.

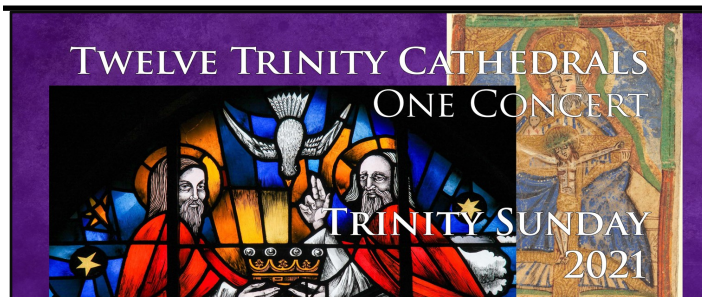
Cathedral Renovation Progresses

Plans for returning to worship in the cathedral building are now starting.

Sunday School Programs for 2021-2022

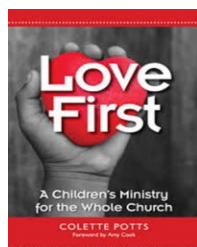

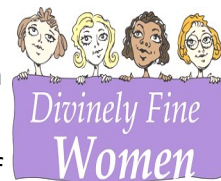

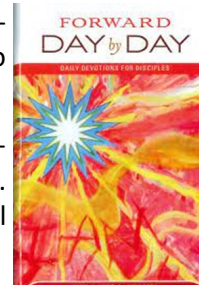

The Order of the Daughters of the King®

The June Meeting of the Saint Hildegard Chapter of the Daughters of the King will be a joint meeting with two other local Chapters. St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Sparks has invited the Reno and Carson City Daughters of the King to join their Chapter on **Saturday, June 5th at 10:00 AM**. This is a meet and greet with our sister Chapters in Northern Nevada as we strive to know other Daughters in our area. This becomes more important as we move towards unifying the DOK Order within the Diocese of Nevada. Our goal is to assemble Nevada, which means having a DOK presence at the state level and to gain a vote at the National level at the Triennial meeting. These are beginning steps toward that goal.

There will also be an installation of a new Daughter for the Sparks Chapter. This will be a wonderful way to support our new Daughter and to get to know her as she enters the Order.

Good News from the Endowment Fund of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral

The Trinity Endowment was established in 1999 to facilitate Christian stewardship amongst its congregation and friends and to promote Trinity's mission, of proclaiming by work and example the good news of God and Christ, seeking and serving Christ in all persons and respecting the dignity of every human being.

The board trustees met on April 12 and want to share the good news with the congregation that the Endowment Fund has a net worth of \$1,012,822! Congratulations to all who have donated to the Fund and to those people who have dedicated their time and talent to achieve this milestone. Additionally, the board trustees adopted Investment Objectives & Policies in January to guide the board going forward, implemented a change from Active Management of the Fund to a 100% Index Fund Investment approach, and an asset allocation of 60% Equity to 40% Fixed Income which has resulted in improved investment performance.

Please consider giving your financial support to Trinity's Endowment Fund this year; your donation ensures an enduring and bright future for Trinity Cathedral.

Protocols and Procedures for Worshipers



We have joyously and gratefully experienced three Sundays now with our 11:00 AM in-person Eucharist. With our beginning guidelines of 40 person fully vaccinated, we did not have the full house anticipated. So as a result, we will move on into June with just the one Sunday Eucharist at 11:00 AM. There is not a need or outcry for multiple Services.

We also gladly report that we are now loosening some of our guidelines as we continue to take reservations (reservations need to be made weekly!) to allow for attendance at worship with fully vaccinate adults. This also allows for families with vaccinated children over 12 years of age to attend. We will still follow protocols for seating to the front when entering and being dismissed starting from the rear. Socializing is reserved for when we are outdoors. We will accommodate a larger number of folks to be attending with at least 3 feet distancing with seating.

With the desire to be singing our hymns and liturgy, we ask that masks continue to be worn. Since we are into the summer months and the choir is on hiatus, we will allow for a masked soloist or duet to enhance the Service.

Let us continue to hold up one another in prayer, and with kindness and patience continue to support one another as we gradually make progress with a return to in-person worship and service. In due time, much of this transition process will be out of our way, and we'll return to a beautifully renovated cathedral worship space. Quickly the time is arriving with new opportunities as well as numerous occasions to celebrate. Presently, we are most thankful for God's guidance and for one another's positivity through these past 18 months and present time.

We will live stream our 11:00 AM Service each Sunday through our website with the YouTube platform, and it will be posted to Facebook later that day.

Vestry Minutes Summary—May 18, 2021

The meeting was conducted by Zoom Meeting and opened with prayer at 6:05 PM followed by a reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement. Judy Landis, Trinity's Christian Education Director and EYC Coordinator, provided an in-depth review of Trinity's children's and youth education programs. She introduced the "Love First" program that is an intergenerational Christian education program. Vestry will be provided with copies of the "Love First" book to read and discuss at the next vestry meeting. The May meeting agenda and minutes of the April 20, 2021 Vestry meeting were approved.

Financial Matters: Lindsay Campbell, Assistant Treasurer, reviewed the April 2021 financial reports. She



reported that online giving has been positive, and more members are signing up to use the online system. Terry Cain, Junior

Warden, reported the Faith Like a River Budget is proceeding as expected on schedule and on budget. He also presented a pledge analysis on both stewardship and the Faith Like a River funds indicating receipts received are largely as expected and consistent with commitments. Most members who have historically pledged have made commitments this year, and there are a number of new pledging members. Pledge amounts are, on average, consistent with historical numbers, although some individual pledges have decreased or increased, respectively. Terry reported the Trinity Endowment Board concurred with the Vestry's proposed revisions to the Trust Instrument. Vestry voted to approve the revised Trust Instrument as amended at the April meeting.

Committee Reports: the Finance and Administration Committee minutes of the May 10 meeting were previously distributed to the Vestry. The committee will begin reviewing the operating budget at its June meeting. Vestry discussed the current status of the Paycheck Protection Program loan forgiveness application. Terry Cain reported the Property Committee continues to research security systems for the campus. Vestry approved awarding contract for maintenance of fire systems on the Cathedral campus to Legacy Fire

Systems. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, provided an update on the Cathedral building renovation. He commented the scaffolding is fully removed and painting is near completion. Next steps include tile flooring installation and hanging of light fixtures. Renovation completion is estimated for August 11. Reinstallation of the pipe organ will begin the week of August 23. He commented there are contingency funds that may allow reconsideration of some aspects of the project that were removed during the project budgeting process.

Dean's Report: Father William reported the first in-person service held on May 16 went well with 37 parishioners in attendance. He noted that Howard Bennett helped Saint Catherine's Parish secure a reed organ and installed the organ in their worship space. He also reported that Trinity's St. Cecelia's choir will be joining a number of other Trinity cathedral choirs across the country in a joint Sunday coral presentation celebrating Trinity Sunday.

Old Business: Father William reported he is waiting for a decision from the Orvis Foundation regarding Trinity's grant request. Terry Cain reported on the HolyCow! Consulting assessment tool and referenced the summary provided to Vestry. The assessment survey is scheduled for three weeks in June. A final report will be made to Vestry and the parish thereafter.

New Business: Father William reported on various requests for use of Trinity's facilities by outside organizations. It was discussed that all groups must complete a facility use agreement and comply with any Covid 19 precautions established by the Cathedral. Father William reported briefly on the diocesan Bishop candidates' selection process and the potential meeting opportunities during the candidate "walk-about." Vestry discussed preliminary plans for the 2021-2022 stewardship campaign process. Father William reported the website is nearing completion with a presentation to vestry during this month. The meeting adjourned at 8:20 PM.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 22, 2021 at 6 PM via Zoom.
