From the Dean's Pen ...

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

As we are passing through the 12 days of Christmas and entering into the Season of Epiphany our focus has first been on the humanity of Christ, the Incarnation, thus Christmas. Then we move to a focus on the divinity of Christ or Epiphany, meaning revelation; God being revealed through the life and ministry of Jesus of Nazareth. Christmas and Epiphany teach us about the two natures of Christ, human and divine. Perhaps this doctrine of the two natures of Christ have a great deal of relevance for us today as we continue to experience the COVID-19 pandemic and continue with our safety practices of isolation, social distancing and mask-wearing.

I know how tired and weary we are with all of this. We are most anxious these days, and we continue to



pray for a decrease in deaths and in the rise of positive cases. We are familiar with the teachings and stories of Jesus bringing life to all, but especially to those considered unworthy and on the fringes of society. It is to us that God is speaking, continuing to fulfill his promises and never abandoning us.



I encourage you to continue in patience and love. Because of faith, these are just a few of the gifts that sustain us. Allow the scripture we utilize each week in worship, or from a daily devotional or lectionary, to speak to your heart. Reflect on the season of the church year and how Christ is manifested to us individually and corporately. There is much Good News to be heard and experienced. 2021, as we all say, "has to be a better year." It will be as we continue to equip ourselves, nurture our faith, and trust in the living presence of our Christ and Savior God.

The Calling Birds

One of the things that's become crystal clear during this pandemic is our human need to stay connected to one another. Some have noted that "social distancing" should really be called "physical distancing" since we are in fact finding safe ways to stay socially connected to one another even while keeping our (physical) distance. Of course, Zoom meetings, emails, and recorded worship services which show up on Facebook and YouTube have been huge in our efforts to stay together, but there is another, low tech way that has been important too. It's the telephone. Not everyone has a computer or smart phone or the internet, but everyone has a telephone, and many members of Trinity have been using their phones to stay connected to other members. Hence the title of this column. While the song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas," celebrates the four calling birds, I know that there are more than four of you who are making calls to other Trinity folk.



So here's what you get to do. Let me know whom you are calling. Let me know of others who are calling. Let me know the categories of folks you are calling, i.e., those who don't have the internet, the recently bereaved, those having birthdays, those in your groups (Divinely Fine Women, Baby Bundles, A Lot of Good Men, Circle of Friends, etc.), those who had to evacuate because of the Pinehaven Fire—I could go on at some length, because I know you are going to great lengths to stay connected. While we are at it, let me know of ways other than the telephone that you are connecting to one another. I have heard that some of you deliver devotional booklets; another, cooked meals; someone else, a copy of the December newsletter when our COVID-19 outbreak kept us from mailing hard copies.

I want to hear these stories, and I want you to hear them too and to know how big is this community of caring people. I will report back in the February newsletter. I realize that some of you may be reluctant to report in, not wanting to brag on yourself, feeling it is not seemly to do so. But it's not really about you; it's about the power of the Word which you have been hearing for these many years—the Word which proclaims that you are loved, cared for, forgiven. That Word has taken root in you and the fruit of that Word is that you care for one another. This is something to rejoice in and so be reminded of the strength of this faith community. COVID-19 and its ravages will no doubt change us, but I believe your love for one another will shine all that much stronger. It is that love which will take us into the new chapter, no matter how much else has changed.

Music Notes from Dr. Gordon

**Finding The Bluebird of Happiness in 2021**

A few years ago, in my early 30's, I suffered a deep depression. As my social life and work productivity came to a screeching halt, it had a devastating effect. The paralysis I experienced only loosened its grip with the help of a professional counselor. Slowly, I made important changes to priorities and gave energy to my own journey with music. Since so much of my work as K-12 music educator and church musician is focused on empowering others, it was a gift to concentrate on personal growth for a while. Factors I credit to my successful exit from depression include: the incredibly generous support of clergy, friends, and colleagues, learning to create appropriate balance, and setting new boundaries in my life. Also, the expertise of the counselor helped me decipher the path that led to becoming a workaholic and how to avoid such a scenario in the future. I share this because we have been so focused on keeping ourselves and others physically safe during this pandemic. I can't help but wonder, how are we doing with our mental health and spiritual health? I see signs that many people around me are struggling. I, too, feel extremely exhausted by the sustained stress of being in crisis mode.

During my journey back to mental healthiness I re-discovered the Bluebird as a sign of hope. Although well documented in Chinese mythology, Native American folklore (Chochiti Tribe), and in Russian fairy tales, I made the association thanks to a series of songs i. e. "The Bluebird of Happiness" recorded by Jimmy Durante, and "There's a bluebird on your windowsill" recorded by Doris Day. There are countless other songs where the bluebird shows up but none dearer than Judy Garland singing "Over the Rainbow" and pondering, "if happy little bluebirds fly beyond the rainbow, why can't I?"

To counterbalance the depressing, daily news cycle, I've started a running list of the things I'm looking forward to in 2021. There's not enough room to list all the items but here's a few:

- I look forward to watching the progress on the cathedral renovation.
- I look forward to getting to play our repaired and updated pipe organ!
- The re-dedication of our church building and the festive celebrations.
- I look forward to restarting the *Pipes on the River* series – in person!
- I look forward to making music with more Trinity musicians.

I hope there's many things you're looking forward to in 2021. However, if you're feeling a bit depressed, and options like exercise or other strategies aren't helping, it may be time to seek professional help. You have a great resource in the cathedral clergy and staff, and we care about your physical, spiritual, and mental health. Please let us know if we can provide prayer or other support. Happy 2021 and keep looking for the Bluebird!

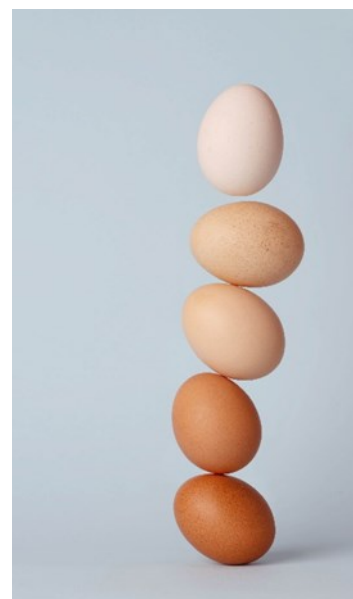

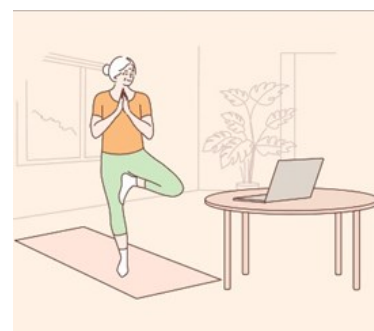

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE A PART OF THE CIRCLE OF FRIENDS?

Circle of Friends is a group of about ten people who commit to daily check-in phone calls with each other. This is how it works: You are given one name to call. You call this person, usually in the



morning, but anytime is okay, to check in on them--how they are, what's going on for the day, etc. If for some reason you can't reach your person, there's a system in place to do a further

check. In turn, you also receive a phone call from someone who checks in with you. Every so often, the leader of the group switches the names around, so you have a "new" person to call and you have a "new" person checking in with you.

St. Paul's Food Pantry is extremely thankful for our past and continued support.

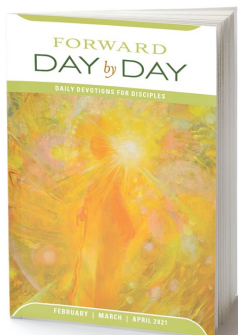

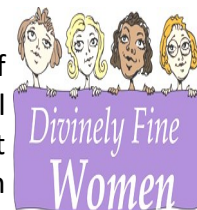

Thank You One and All for a Successful Angel Tree Project



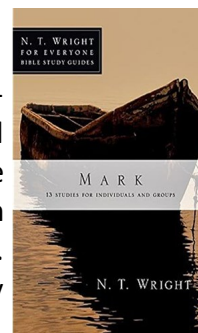
Empowered by the Holy Spirit, our vision as Daughters of the King is to know Jesus Christ, to make him known to others, and to become reflections of God's love throughout the world.

Bible and Books is a study group which meets weekly on Sundays at 9:00AM

The group chooses a book which has a connection to the Bible. The participants read the assigned material during the week and then discuss it during the sessions. They just finished Walter Wangerin, Jr.'s *The Book of God: The Bible as a Novel*, and for their next book have chosen N.T. Wright's *Mark: 20 Studies for Individuals and Groups*. N.T. Wright is a well-known Anglican New Testament theologian who has a fresh and appealing way of teaching the Bible. This book has questions to ponder and helpful tips on leading the sessions. Over twenty weeks, the entire Gospel of Mark will be read.



Canon Ruth hosts the Zoom meetings and attends them, but leadership is shared among those who wish to do so. The group is open to anyone, including folks who don't normally attend Trinity (of course Zoom makes it possible to include those who don't live anywhere near Reno!). Vestry Summary, December 21, 2020



Vestry Notes

The meeting was conducted by Zoom Meeting conference and opened with prayer at 6:08 p.m. followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and individual blessings. The agenda (with adjustments) and minutes (with amendments) of the November 23, 2020 Vestry meeting were approved. **Treasurer report:** due to the closure of the parish hall the usual treasurer tasks including preparation of the month-end financial statements are unavailable. Father William reported a generous gift from a parishioner will assist in meeting our budget needs for the 2020 budget. David Morgan reported on the status of the forgiveness of the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) funds received in 2020. The Vestry approved the clergy housing allowance for 2021. David Morgan provided an update on the funds to be distributed to Trinity from the estate of a beneficiary. **Finance, Facilities, and Administration Committee report:** Lynne Charlat, Junior Warden, reported the unanimous email vote to approve the organ renovation upgrades. She shared a note of appreciation from Dr. Gary Gordon, Director of Music and Organist, for the support of the organ improvements. Lynne reported on recent vandalism of Cathedral property including broken windows in the crypt of the sanctuary building and the administrative office in the parish hall. Construction security fencing will be installed surrounding the entire property for the remainder of the renovation project. Lynne reported the parish hall building has been cleaned in accordance with CDC guidelines and was reopened on December 21. She provided an update on the sanctuary renovation scheduled to begin January 4. Lynne also reported the 2021 budget process is on hold pending the results of additional pledge solicitation efforts. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, reported the committee has completed a draft lay employee handbook that has been distributed to members of the Vestry for review and comment. Jim reported the background check process is pending further communication with the diocese on how the process will be implemented. Lynne provided an update on

the continuing work by Dr. Gordon in creating a new Trinity website. **Ministry reports:** Lindsay Campbell, Assistant Treasurer, reported on the present status of the stewardship campaign. She stated there are 188 returned pledge forms totaling \$481,131 which is approximately \$130,000 short of the stewardship goal. Father William shared the thanks from the Daughters of the King for the Vestry's support of the Angel Tree Project. He noted the Trinity chapter received recognition of the Angel Tree Project in the national newsletter of the DOK. Father William reported the Sack Lunch Program will resume Wednesday, December 23. **Dean's report:** Father William reported on several activities including funeral service conducted by Canon Hanusa and the hospitalization of several parishioner. He commented on the taping of the Lesson and Carols service that will be part of the Mission District presentation for all parishes on December 27. Father William commented on the search process for the new Bishop. He also commented on the preparation for the Trinity Annual Meeting. **Canon for Parish Life report:** Canon Hanusa commented on the current status of a grief group that has been meeting via Zoom. She indicated there is interest in formation of a second group. **Vestry:** Vestry discussed various methods of improving outreach to parishioners through phone calls and other methods. **Nomination Committee report:** Kate Flocchini, committee chair, reported the following nominees for election to the 2021 Vestry: Eloy Ituarte, Gary Fuller, Brandon Harjer, and Carolyn Hoffman. Kate also reported that Harvey Fennell is nominated to the Trinity Endowment Board. **Administration:** Father William discussed planning for the Trinity Annual Meeting. The meeting is scheduled for Sunday, January 31, 2021. **Old Business:** Vestry approved increasing the Cyber Liability insurance coverage to \$1 million and to maintain the current Crime Coverage level of \$50,000. Vestry expressed appreciation to Dr. Gordon for all his efforts in producing the weekly Carillon publication. The meeting adjourned at 7:53 PM. The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 18, 2021 at 6 PM.

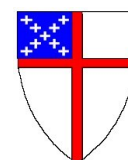
**Restoration in January**
