From the Dean's Pen ...

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Alleluia! *Amen.*

As we continue the celebration of this Eastertide and anticipate our observance of Pentecost (May 23) and Trinity Sunday (May 30) I share some thoughts with you in regard to future directions.

First, it is good to know that we are anticipating an initial attempt to do a limited re-opening for worship in the parish hall with this month of May. We thank the Re-opening Protocol and Procedure Committee (Margaret Zuccarini, Ken Hines, Jeannie Arps and Dr. Eloy Ituarte) for their most thorough and diligent attention to this document. As of this writing, I have received a positive response from our Diocesan Standing Committee for our opening approval. This document is available to any member; call the cathedral office if you desire a copy. I do ask that you please note in this newsletter the listing of important details for our worshipers in regard to essential procedures with in-person worship. (*see page 9*)

Second, as we anticipate re-opening with limited worship attendance in the parish hall and look forward to the completion of the interior work in the cathedral and that re-opening, issues surface in regard to our needs with programming and ministries. There are also security issues not only

with the property but safety during our gatherings. Our Property Committee has been spending a great deal of time inventorying our needs and options. In addition, to assist us in this present down-time, the vestry



has made a decision to participate in a parish wide survey to “take the pulse” of the membership. You will be seeing information soon in regards to “Holy Cow! Consulting” materials.

Third, it is most important to recognize that our world has been turned up-side-down these past 15 months. We have changed, and there is obviously a new normal to be explored. I am proud of our staff, vestry, and leadership in guiding us through these challenging times. We have learned much through this pandemic and accept this challenge that such change is inevitable for our future success, growth, and outreach. We need to grasp onto those values that are essential to our faith and witness as followers of Christ in evaluating our goals and programming. Through all of this I continue to encourage kindness and patience. We are doing our best for the common good of our cathedral community and its future. May we continue to support one another in love and prayer.

Worship Notes

Sweet Swap

I don't take the time to listen to podcasts very often but one was strongly recommended to me recently, so I caved in. It was one of Mockingbird's (www.mbird.com), date of March 1, 2021 (Episode 206: The Goalposts Are Moving). I'm glad I listened to it. But before I tell you about this podcast, if you don't know about Mockingbird Ministries, check it out. They look deeply at contemporary culture all the while noticing where the gospel is—and isn't. While not affiliated with any particular denomination, a number of their staff are Episcopalians. I think you will enjoy the site.



Of the number of topics that were covered in this podcast, one in particular intrigued me. David Zahl, the director of Mockingbird Ministries, told the story of his brother's addiction to a particular video game. Like many addictions, it was taking over his brother's life. His sleep, work, family were all being affected. He was sneaking around, hiding his addiction. His wife begged him to stop; he knew he needed to stop and did try. Nothing worked--until something new came along. That something new was a new video game, one that was less addicting. The new game was a gift from God, said David. It rescued his brother from the addiction which was ruining his life.

Isn't that the way it is with us? We want to give up some bad habit, be better, love more, hate less. But despite our resolutions and Lenten intentions, all our trying harder, our boot-strapping, we can't crack it. The Law, the "shoulds," the "oughtas," cannot fix us. Something better has to come along and replace what was there before. This replacement must come from outside, from beyond ourselves. Very often it is a surprise, because when we are trying to be better, all the focus is on ourselves. We aren't on the lookout for a rescue from the outside.

The replacement for all of our strivings to be better people is the Christ who didn't come to make us better people. He came to break the back of the Law by allowing it to break him. In a mysterious interaction within the Trinity, God swaps all of our "not-good-enoughness" with the righteousness of Christ. Having already been declared righteous, we can quit our narcissistic attempts to make ourselves righteous. We are free to set our sights on others' needs and ready ourselves to receive the rescue gifts which God is providing.

Music Notes from Dr. Gordon



By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion. There on the poplars we hung our harps, for there our captors asked us for songs, our tormentors demanded songs of joy; they said, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!" How can we sing the songs of the Lord while in a foreign land? If I forget you, Jerusalem, may my right hand forget its skill. May my tongue cling to the roof of my mouth if I do not remember you, if I do not consider Jerusalem my highest joy.

In several ways Nevada has begun to feel like home. I travel around town now with more confidence, use my GPS less often, and I have favorite grocery stores, post office etc.. Yet, I still feel like I'm in a strange, foreign land; even though unlike the Israelites in Babylonian captivity, I arrived by my own free will. If I were composing a modern psalm, I'd include questions like, how do we sing during the time of Covid-19? How do we sing with our facial expressions covered in masks; our voices hindered from the ease of diction, natural projection, and blending we once took for granted? How do we sing without harming those around us? These are just a few of the questions we've struggled with together over the past few months. In fact, it was a year ago on May 20-21, 2020, when I interviewed for the Director of Music and Organist position and was privileged to meet members of the Trinity community in person for the first time.

I celebrate our return to limited in-person worship in just a few days, and I'm grateful for all the work done by our re-opening committee to help us prepare. I also grieve with members of the choir that for safety reasons, we won't be able to raise our voices in congregational song. So, to fulfill our calling as creative, people of faith, who serve God through music, we will be rehearsing through May and recording anthems for Pentecost and Trinity Sundays. We look forward to sharing our anthems and hymns via our Facebook and YouTube platforms and pray they will help you connect in a meaningful way to these important days in the church year. My second Pfizer vaccine shot is scheduled for May 13th and I look forward to joining you in person for Trinity Sunday, on May 30th. "Stay calm and carry on" as the saying goes, and remember that we are God's people.

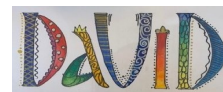

Renovation Project Update

The cathedral building renovation project is moving forward and is expected to be completed by mid-August. New lighting is being installed that will light, for the first time, the beautiful, wood ceiling. Another first is a fire suppression system in the nave space. The scaffolding that has been in place for several weeks will begin to come down in early May. Painting of the walls has begun, and lighting fixtures in the bell tower are being replaced. Construction of two new restrooms, one of which is ADA compliant, is underway. We anticipate the installation of the new flooring will begin in the early part of June.

Lighting improvements in the Bishop Lewis Chapel are being made as the alter orientation is moving from the south wall to the east wall. The pipe organ that was in Philip Manwell's home will be relocated to the south wall of the chapel. Mr. Manwell was one of Trinity's former organists, and the organ was donated to the cathedral by his family following his death.

A new audio system will be installed. In addition,

there will be cameras installed that will permit us to continue providing live streaming of services when we return to the cathedral space. The cathedral pipe organ is expected to begin reinstallation the week of August 23.

The renovation project is on time and within the vestry-approved budget. This project would not have been possible without the significant financial support provided by our parish members. Thank you for all the gifts you give to Trinity.

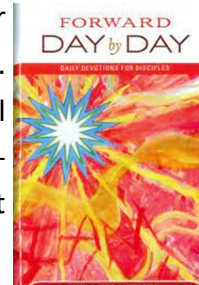

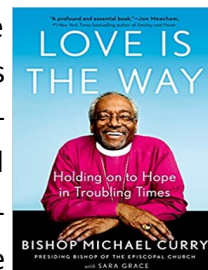

The meeting was conducted by Zoom Meeting and opened with prayer at 6:12 PM followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and sharing of individual blessings. The agenda was amended, and minutes of the March 23, 2021 meeting were approved as amended. **Financial Matters:** Lindsay Campbell, Assistant Treasurer, reviewed the financial statements for the month of March. She also reported that quarterly pledge statements were sent via email to 90% of all pledgers. Terry Cain, Junior Warden, reported the cathedral renovation project budget is proceeding as expected. Vestry approved the revised Endowment Board Trust Instrument as modified. **Committee Reports: Finance and Administration Committee:** Vestry approved the proposed governing procedures for Janet's Fund as recommended by the Committee. **Property Committee:** Terry Cain reported on the activities of the Committee which is working on recommendations regarding security on the cathedral campus. **Building Renovation Committee:** Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, provided an update on the progress of the cathedral building renovation. He noted scaffolding would be coming down in May. Completion of the renovation is expected in mid-August. **Facilities Re-opening Committee:** Ken Hines and Margaret Zuc-

Father William reported on the Northwest Diocese Mission District Zoom meeting held on Saturday, April 17. He also reminded vestry members of the Zoom retreat meeting with Bishop Waggoner scheduled for Saturday, April 24. Vestry approved contracting with Holy Cow! Consulting for a parish-wide assessment survey. **New Business:** Father William reported the Wardens will be joining the staff meetings on the Tuesday after Vestry to help convey information to them. The meeting adjourned at 8:16 PM. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 18 at 6:00 PM via Zoom.

In-Person Worship Guidelines

Protocols and Procedures for Worshipers

Re-opening Guidelines



With re-opening for in-person worship, there are very specific protocols and procedures that worshippers will need to follow. Consistent with our Diocese, Region 8 Bishops, and the Episcopal Church as a whole, we are being quite conservative, erring on the side of safety as we begin. This of course can be loosened as the community shows diminishing cases of Covid and the state and county medical guidelines mandate as such.

Specific protocols are as follows:




- ◆ We will plan for 40 fully vaccinated worshippers with one Sunday service at 11:00 AM.
- ◆ Reservations are to be made on a first come, first serve basis with a phone call to the cathedral office Tuesday through Thursday (10:00 AM to 4:00 PM) prior to the Sunday service.
- ◆ Attendees will be asked to verify contact information, give names of others who may be joining you as well as their contact information.
- ◆ With your first reservation you will be asked for the dates of your vaccinations. (Verification of the dates would be helpful.)
- ◆ A mask must be worn at all times while on the cathedral campus, except when consuming the Communion host.
- ◆ Ushers will seat and dismiss you. Communion will be brought to you at your seat by the serving priest or celebrant.
- ◆ An offering basket will be at the front of the back aisle – a collection cannot be passed.
- ◆ Bulletins will be on your seat, and when dismissed, if not taking it home, you may place it into the recycle basket near the exit.
- ◆ Remaining inside for socializing cannot occur at present.
- ◆ Most important: worship attendees are asked to commit to report to the cathedral office, within a 14-day period, if experiencing illness or symptoms of the coronavirus after having attended worship.

When coming to worship, you will arrive wearing a mask, and will be checked at the door to insure your reservation. An usher will lead you inside to be seated. We will seat people to the front first and move to the back. At the close of worship, ushers will dismiss you by working from the back first and moving to the front. Moving around the space and physically socializing cannot occur while in the space. We will not be singing; we will utilize non-wind instrumental music only. Communion happens with one specie only; a Communion host that will be dropped into your cupped hands. We will not be able to handle “walk-ins” at this time.

Reservations for Sunday, May 16 Worship begin on Tuesday, May 11 at 10:00 AM.

We will live stream our 11:00 AM Service each Sunday through our website with the YouTube platform, and it will be posted to Facebook later that day.
