Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

As we get Halloween behind us and an election (Please VOTE, November 3rd if you have not already done so), our thoughts hopefully will gravitate to a mood of thankfulness. It is this time of year that we are most mindful of the bounty of the earth and contemplate our own Thanksgiving Day observances, though I know many will have very different plans this year because of COVID.

From Canon Ruth

I count myself one of the lucky ones. I get to go to work. I have enough money to live on and to buy masks. Though old, I am relatively healthy. I live alone, unlikely to get Covid from my two cats. No one close to me has been sick with, or died from, Covid. "I haven't been much affected by this pandemic," I told myself recently. But then, almost immediately, I said to myself, "Self, who are you kidding? You preach into a camera in a nearly empty room. You sing while wearing a mask. You struggle to learn the rudiments of Zoom and then work mightily to convince people to 'try it just one time; you might like it.' Your favorite part of giving blood is to see if you have Covid antibodies swimming in your veins. It occurs to you to wonder if mammograms can be done via Tele Health. Half the time you can't remember to grab a mask on your way out, even though a bowlful is parked right at the door . . ." I went on at some length.



No doubt you too have had a similar conversation with your Self. If not, I encourage it. This is not to have a self-indulgent pity party when so many have it worse. But it is important to recognize the weariness, exhaustion, and strain with which we are burdened. It is a confession of sorts—confessing that we are bodies and have needs and limitations; confessing that we don't know where this is heading; confessing that we don't really know what are the best things to be doing at this time. In short, it is to confess that we do not know what God is up to with this pandemic. With this confession comes another, that is, the confession of faith that God--Father, Son and Holy Spirit--has not abandoned this world, but in the midst of the unknowns, walks with every one of us, and despite the destruction, destabilization, and death, is creating something new. Trusting that we have such a God, we are free to be fully human--free not to have to try to do all we can to maintain the old normal, free to just sit with all the not-knowing, free to rest.



Vestry Summary, October 19, 2020



Vestry Notes

The meeting was conducted by video conference and opened with prayer at 6:05 p.m. with a prayer followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and individual blessings. The agenda (with adjustments), minutes of the September 21, 2020 Vestry meeting, and September Financial Report were approved or accepted.

Treasurer report: David Morgan indicated the financial reports presented a deficit, which was expected. John Lilley reported the Endowment Board has prepared a Trust document which is currently under legal review and will be presented to the Vestry soon. Terry Cain provided an update on the 2021 Stewardship Pledge Campaign. Lindsay Campbell reported on the number of pledges and amounts presently received. Father William reported the budget committee meeting will be on November 3. David Morgan presented information regarding a parishioner who wishes to establish a fund in memory of his wife. A memorandum of understanding is currently under development and will be presented to the Vestry for review and acceptance. **Finance, Facilities, and Administration Committee:** Lynne Charlat, provided an update on the final details to start the sanctuary renovation project. Lynne also provided information on possible improvements and modifications of the pipe organ that would be beneficial to complete prior to reinstallation. Lynne Charlat will be the official point-of-contact person for the sanctuary renovation project until at least Annual Meeting scheduled for January 24, 2021. **Ministry Reports:** Father William reported the drop-off for St. Paul's Food Pantry continues to go well. He reported the Daughters of the King have received 100 names from Stead Elementary School as gift recipients for the Angel Tree Project. **Dean's Report:** Father William indicated that clergy are working on developing a midweek Advent Service. He also indicated staff is working on virtual holiday services. There will be on November 11 a staff workshop to plan the 2021 Calendar Year. **Canon for Parish Life Report:** Canon Ruth reported the EYC and JYC met for the first time during September. **Vestry:** Father William commended Vestry members for continuing to contact parishioners. Father William appointed Kate Flocchini to chair the Nominating Committee. The committee includes Lynne Charlat, Eloy Ituarte, Gretchen Wolfe, and Robert Andrade, and two at-large members. **Administration:** the Nevada Episcopal Diocesan Annual Convention met on Saturday, October 10. Father William reported that it is notable that a budget was not passed and there will be a future meeting for a budget vote. He also reported staff completed a Zoom Meeting workshop on October 15. Lynne Charlat reported work continues on a new website with launch anticipated in January 2021. **Old Business:** Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, reported a task group is working on revisions to a lay employee handbook as well as a policy and procedure manual. **New Business:** Jeannie Arps reported she is continuing to work on COVID-19 planning documents for possible future opening of facilities. Father William reported on the organization and purpose of the Cathedral Chapter. The meeting adjourned at 8:15 PM. The next meeting is November 23, 2020 at 6:00 PM.

.....A Message from the Kid's Corner.....**Children's Education:**

My core values concerning Christian education and faith formation are as follows:

1. Christian education for our children inspires them to grow in relationship with a loving, grace-filled, personal and present God. Faith is a life-long journey; it bears fruit when we share our faith with others.
2. Learning is a 2-way street: Just as children learn from adults, we, too, can learn from our children.
3. Faith comes alive when we can see ourselves as part of the Holy story, and can, therefore, integrate faith into daily life

**Godly Play and Holy Moly**

As I continue to meet some of you, I am grateful for the warm welcome I have received. Because of COVID, our Sunday programs are different. First, all classes are conducted via Zoom. Secondly, we have extended Sunday School to one hour. Thirdly, we, at Trinity, believe the whole family is included in the congregation, and therefore, we want to encourage children to become engaged and worship with us. The third Sunday of the month will offer a children's story.

Godly Play is for children age 3 through second grade. Each child receives a packet containing materials for eight weeks. Parents are asked to pick up the packets in the church office every two months.

The Holy Moly class is for older children; third grade through fifth grade. The curriculum incorporates visual, auditory, and tactile learning styles while engaging with Holy Scripture. Each student receives a learner's packet specific for each session.

Godly Play and Holy Moly are successful because we have faith-filled, inspiring teachers who have offered their time to share their faith with our children-- Rebecca Dixon, Kait Flocchini, Dennise Howard, Laura Jolle, Ginny Nelson, Gretchen Wolfe, and Margot Davidson. We give thanks for these women for their on-going service and dedication to our children.

**Episcopal Youth Community (EYC/JYC)**

EYC/JYC is a great way for the youth grades 6-12 to connect with their peers as well as adult leaders of Trinity. We meet on Zoom every Sunday from 12:30 p.m. -1:30 p.m. The objective is to continue to nurture our youth as they develop healthy balanced lives of faith.

Under normal conditions, we would be meeting in the church for worship and serving as acolytes, or out in the community serving or just enjoying a pizza or movie night with friends. We have had to adjust.

Therefore, we began meeting virtually on Sunday, October 18. Father William will be sharing his creative gifts with the community. The Rev. Ruth and Judy will be co-hosting. Jade Hickman and Guy Moreno are the adult leaders. We give thanks to Jade and Guy for offering their gifts to the youth community.
