From Canon Ruth

Generosity

Recently I ran across some notes I took in 2011 while I was attending a church conference in California. The speaker was Mark Allan Powell, a New Testament exegete and (now retired) seminary professor. He was speaking on the well-known passage in Matthew 6:21, which reads, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." This passage is often misquoted, or perhaps intentionally misunderstood. Folks turn it around and say, "Where your heart is, that's where your treasure is." It seems to make good sense. For instance, if your heart is with your family, you will pour your treasures



into their welfare and interests. If your heart is with your work, there you will focus your resources. If your heart is with your alma mater . . . You get the idea. Matthew is cannier, however, about human behavior. If we wait until our heart is committed to a person or community, our treasure may never arrive to give assistance to said person or community. Quoting my notes, Powell said: "Where your treasure is, there your heart is. Your heart will catch up when you behave in ways that you want to become. Pretend if necessary. Act in generous ways and you will become generous."

It's stewardship season, as you all know by now. I needn't belabor Powell's point. Just know that this community known as Trinity Episcopal Cathedral would welcome all the generosity you can muster, even if at this point you are only pretending.

Powell added something else after his comment on this Matthean passage. Again quoting my notes, he said, "To grow spiritually, do these four things: go to church, say your prayers, read your Bible, give generously." That's a pretty simple formula and I think all four of those may be things that from time to time require pretending. It's like eating. Not every meal is wonderfully sumptuous, every bite tasty with nicely paired wines and the company pleasant with nary a single obnoxious soul at the table. Some meals are cheese and crackers grabbed on the run. Both feed the body, and very few of us miss a meal just because every meal can't be a sumptuous feast. So too, not every worship service attended, every prayer said, every Scripture passage read, will inspire. But we keep showing up for all of it, pretending when necessary.

Pipes on the River



I am very excited for the official relaunch of our free organ recital series on Friday, Nov. 12th at Noon, featuring Dr. Angela Kraft Cross. This will also mark the first official concert in the Cathedral, following our renovation, and upgrades to the organ console; which now include a moveable platform. Having the console front and center will be great for both performer and audience alike!

Dr. Kraft Cross Biography – excerpted from her website.

Dr. Kraft Cross has performed extensively on both organ and piano, having given over five hundred concerts across the United States, in Canada, England, Holland, France, Hungary, Korea, Lesotho and Guam, including such venues as Notre Dame Cathedral, St. Sulpice and the Madeleine in Paris, Washington National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., St. Patrick's Cathedral and St. Thomas Church in New York City, Methuen Memorial Music Hall and Trinity Church in Boston, E. Power Biggs' organ at Harvard, and Westminster Abbey, Paul's Cathedral and Southwark Cathedral in London. She has released eight solo CD albums, recorded locally in California as well as in Paris,

Lyon and London. Three of her organ albums have received critical acclaim in The American Organist magazine. Her most recent releases include a 2013 CD of her organ compositions entitled *Sharing the Journey*, recorded at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles and in December 2016, her new *WIDOR chez Widor* album, featuring Symphonies 4,5,6 and 7 on Widor's hometown Cavaillé-Coll organ at St. François-de-Sales in Lyon, France. Her organ recordings can be heard on Pipedreams with Michael Barone on American Public Media. She has served as the organist of the Congregational Church of San Mateo since 1993, and is currently the Artist in Residence. She is also a regular organ recitalist at the California Palace of the Legion of Honor in San Francisco. In addition to her musical career, Dr. Kraft Cross retired in 2011 having worked for 22 years as an ophthalmic surgeon at the Kaiser Permanente Hospital in Redwood City, and now volunteers as an ophthalmologist at Samaritan House in Redwood City. Bishop-Elect Bonforte Gardner

Interfaith Thanksgiving Service

Elizabeth Bonforte Gardner elected bishop of Nevada

The Rev. Elizabeth Bonforte Gardner was elected as the eleventh bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Nevada on Oct. 8, 2021.

Gardner was selected from a slate of four candidates after a discernment process spanning almost two years. Beginning with a list of interested applicants, a diocesan search



committee reviewed and selected the candidates to put before the church. The balloting process required a 50-percent-plus-one vote occurring simultaneously from the two voting bodies. The voting members are lay delegates from each parish in the state and voting clergy. Gardner was selected on the fourth ballot.

"This discernment brought four wonderful, gifted candidates," said the Rt. Rev. Jim Waggoner, assisting bishop to the Diocese of Nevada. "Through meditation and prayer, our voting clergy and delegates selected the person who will serve the Episcopal Diocese of Nevada in her many-faceted needs and potential. We welcome Rev. Gardner and look forward to having them as part our church family."

Gardner, currently rector of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Alexandria, Virginia, founded Potomac Episcopal, a collaboration of four churches that banded together during the pandemic to expand pastoral and missional work in the community.

"To the three other candidates, we are deeply grateful to you for your willingness to have invested your time and energy in this process. You have each brought us new insights into who we are, and how the Spirit is moving among us. We have been blessed by the experience of getting to know you and have been strengthened and encouraged by your presence. We wish you the best and know you will continue to carry forth the work of the church," Waggoner said.

Gardner will be consecrated bishop on March 5, 2022 in Las Vegas. This ceremony will position her to assume responsibilities for the pastoral and administrative work of the diocese. The Most Rev. Michael Curry, Presiding Bishop, will officiate at the consecration.

Our COVID Protocols:

As we have moved back into our Cathedral space, we will be under the same protocols and procedures that have been in practice since we opened for in-person worship in the Parish Hall since the month of May. Additional changes occurred in July as our Governor, CDC, and our Diocesan Office addressed the surge with the Delta variant, that masks must be worn indoors and that we cannot be singing.

Our requirements for worship services and any activity on campus are:

- We are wearing masks at all times in-doors.
- Adults and children 12 and older are required to be vaccinated.
- Worshippers must sign in at the door (A contact list is required. If a break-out case would occur, we would be able to notify attendees of a need to quarantine).
- We are able to handle only 100 worshippers at each service.

Baptisms to be Celebrated on Sunday, November 7th All Saints Sunday – 11:00AM



Ministry Moment #4

Services to Return



"Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above..." James 1:17, NRSV

The theme of every perfect gift for this year's stewardship campaign has us all reflecting on gifts that we've given and received. I am giving this Ministry Moment today as a Sunday School (SS) teacher.

As I reflect on being a Sunday School teacher at Trinity, I think of being a SS student as a child. I remember very distinctly the year the church gifted me a bible as a commemoration of my growth as a Christian. It was heavy and gold. And I felt the warmth and love of my church family when I, and my fellow 3rd graders, received that gift during a church service.

Your generous gifts over the last 15 years have enabled Trinity to grow our youth education program immensely. What drew me to Trinity 14 years ago was that same feeling of warmth and unconditional welcome. All the children were included in the whole of our service and they were loved by this church family. It was an honor to become a SS teacher as we developed the separate space for deeper learning of the Christian faith, first on Wednesday afternoons and then moving it to Sundays after the 9AM service. It is a joy to work with all of the dedicated volunteers who serve as SS teachers and with our Christian Education Director, Judy Landis. It is amazing to witness the *Spirit* work within our children in the program that includes toddlers to teens. Without your generous and sustained gifts, this program would not be able to offer so much to families in our parish.

As anyone can tell you, it would be unusual for me to speak to you without mentioning my own children. So, I close with a story about a gift my girls received when they were four and six years old. It was Christmas and my in-laws had come over to our house to open gifts and have breakfast with us that morning. They gave the girls each a card as a gift. Cards are not very exciting to four and six year-olds, so I was anxious that they would express their gratitude for the gift. The girls opened up the cards and inside were two perfectly pressed \$100 bills, which was amazingly generous. As they saw what was inside, their eyes grew bigger. Olivia grabbed the bills, let the card drop to the floor, raised one bill in each hand and yelled: "Wow! Two whole dollars! Yesss!" as she shook the bills triumphantly!

Please know that whatever amount you are able to generously pledge to financially support Trinity is enthusiastically appreciated and supports our ability to give the children of our parish family a warm and safe place to grow in God's unconditional love.

Former Weekend Services to Return

At its September meeting, the Trinity Vestry recommended canvassing parishioners who previously attended the 5:00PM Saturday and 7:30AM Sunday weekend services to determine their interest in returning to in-person worship. The results of the canvas revealed a strong desire to see those services return. In addition, there was enthusiastic support from Trinity's clergy and staff. Subsequently, Vestry at its October 19 meeting voted to re-establish 5:00PM Saturday and 7:30AM Sunday in-person worship effective November 20 and 21. While desirable to begin those services sooner, it takes time to develop the procedures and to confirm the necessary clergy to participate. With this decision, all our pre-COVID weekend worship services will have returned. Return of other midweek services is under study and consideration.
