## *From the Dean's Pen ...*

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

**G**race and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

I know and acknowledge that my heart and spirit are often haunted with frustration regarding the COVID-19 pandemic, the need for us to be isolated, masked, and practicing social distancing. It's hard. My being and my ministry were never wired for working in isolation. Like you, I wish it were over. I wish the pandemic were behind us and life would have some familiar normalcy. I miss our in-person worship, ministry meetings, and social gatherings. But this is our "new normal" for the time being, and our leadership and staff are boldly and willingly facing that challenge.

We are called to persevere, to be hopeful, to be strong. It is not much different than the days of the early church experiencing persecution. The only difference is we all are encountering these challenging days; no one is excluded. As the Episcopal Church, bishops, our diocesan and parish leadership continue to affirm, our priority is the safety of not just our members, but all people that we may encounter at any day or time. We continue to learn more about the virus and rely on the experts, the medical and scientific community for information as how to proceed and ways to protect ourselves and others. We continue to anticipate a drop in the death rate and numbers of those being infected. But that is not happening as people continue to selectively gather without masks, feel that they are invincible, or simply are

We realize that Christmas is a special time for children, and because of these days, families are overly stressed. It would be critical to offer the joy of gifts for our most young and vulnerable population. As all our cathedral programs are adjusted to keep us safe and well, this project will also be taking on new procedures that will help us attain again this year a most successful program.

We will *not* be able to host an Angel Tree Kick-off Dinner, but we will create a method to launch the program with a community blast, advertising, a Compline service (Thursday, October 10 at 7:30 PM), and the monthly newsletter. This year we need to start early and complete shopping prior to the Thanksgiving weekend. Our deadline will be Friday, November 20<sup>th</sup>. A requirement is that once all the gifts are gathered and bundled, they must sit for a 14 day quarantine period before the children and families receive them for take-home delivery.

We realize that some families and individuals will wish to shop, but others will not. Therefore, we are forming a shopping committee. For those uncomfortable about shopping and being out among the community, you simply respond to receiving an angel tag, make your donation payment to Trinity Cathedral (remember to mark "Angel Tree Project" on your check) and our volunteers will take care of your gifting. This new repertoire of texts and tunes has greatly enriched and strengthened my faith. And, in each setting I’ve served I love the role that hymns have played in binding our hearts together. So, in this time of great uncertainty, riots, political turmoil, racial reckonings, and the global health crisis, I turn your attention to the text of one of our most profound Anglican hymns for guidance, hope and support. Also, a wonderful congregational performance of this hymn can be found on YouTube, on the “Hymn Channel” sung by St. Alban’s Church, Bristol. I bet you’ll love it as much as I do!

Pictured above is a self-portrait in my home office/studio, where I’ll be spending many hours over the next few days editing the stewardship campaign videos and preparing to take our choir program “Virtual.” Like you, I am being stretched beyond my comfort zone to embrace new technologies and new ways of making music as a community. 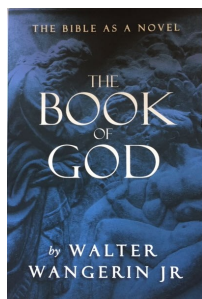

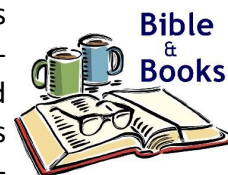
## Centering Prayer

In turn, you also receive a phone call from someone who checks in with you. Every so often, the leader of the group switches the names around, so you have a "new" person to call and you have a "new" person checking in with you.

## Vestry Summary, September 21, 2020



## Vestry Notes

The meeting was conducted by video conference and opened with prayer at 6:10 p.m. with a prayer followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and individual blessings. The agenda (with adjustments), minutes of the August 17 and 19 meetings, and August Financial Report were approved or accepted. **Treasurer report:** David Morgan reported total and net revenue are above budget. Annual deficit is lower than anticipated deficit. He also reported pledge receipts are holding steady. John Lilley reported the Endowment Board is working on the Trust document for future presentation to the vestry. Vestry voted to approve use of the Nevada Episcopal Diocese audit committee to complete Trinity's 2019 audit. Terry Cain provided a report on the planning for the 2021 stewardship campaign. Vestry approved a stewardship resolution for publication. **FFA Committee Report:** Lynne Charlat, Junior Warden, provided an update on the sanctuary renovation. She also reported on the repairs and additions for the pipe organ reinstallation. A committee was appointed to develop a comprehensive policy and procedure manual for Trinity with completion planned by end of fiscal 2020. **Ministry Reports:** Father William reported the St. Paul's Food Pantry drop-off program continues. The Daughters of the King will again coordinate the Angel Tree 2020 event. **Property Committee:** Father William reported increased loitering, graffiti, and usage of cathedral outdoor electrical outlets for mobile phone charging. Reno Police Department recommends installing "no trespassing" signage to allow enforcement action by local police. **Dean's Report:** Father William commented on attendance at various worship and online programs. He also noted changes to the format for the Thursday Healing Service. He announced the "Blessing of the Animals" is scheduled for October 4 as a "drive-through blessing" from 1:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. **Canon for Parish Life:** Rev. Ruth reported the first Sunday School program was a success via Zoom. She reported the EYC group is now large enough to split into two groups (grades 6-8 and 9-12). **Vestry:** Father William commended vestry members for continuing to contact parishioners. He noted the vestry nomination committee consisting of Lynne Charlat, Eloy Ituarte, Gretchen Wolfe, Kait Flocchini, and Joan Collins will begin its work. **Administration:** Father William commented on the recent meeting of the Northwest Mission District where there was significant discussion regarding the formula for assessments. He also reported the Annual Convention will be one day, Friday, October 9. He reported the new weekly publication, *The Carillon* is now available on the website. Efforts are taking place to create a printed version to send to those without internet access. The vestry approved moving the website service to Ekklesia. **Old Business:** Father William provided an update on the office technology changes and improvements. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, reported policy on background and public records check is being developed. Vestry approved using Oxford Documents Management Company to perform these functions as recommended by the Nevada Episcopal Diocese. Vestry voted, subject to legal review and concurrence, adoption of Policy on Registered Sex Offenders. Vestry voted, subject to legal review and concurrence, adoption the Registered Sex Offender Accountability and Conditional Attendance Covenant form. Vestry concurred with request that Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, and Kait Flocchini, the Cathedral legal adviser, formally address with Diocesan leadership the allegation that Junior Warden, Lynne Charlat, engaged in "inappropriate behavior within and beyond the diocese [that] creates a substantial risk to the parish and the diocese that cannot be tolerated" when discussing the establishment of policies and procedures for registered sex offenders in parish life. The meeting adjourned at 9:37 p.m. The next meeting is October 19, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.

Sunday School has started and is being conducted on Zoom 9:45 a.m.-10:45 a.m. We have a teaching staff who are highly inspirational and dedicated to faith formation of children.

**Godly Play:** Age 3 yrs.—2<sup>nd</sup> grade: The first part of the school year focuses on the stories of the Old Testament (Hebrew Scriptures). This is followed by a segment on the Advent and Christmas lessons. In the second half of the school semester, we will begin learning the stories of Jesus' life and ministry. The Godly Play method of storytelling leaves a great deal up to children's explorations and imaginations. If your child has not attended Sunday school and you would like to enroll them in one of the groups, please contact Judy.

**Holy Moly:** 3<sup>rd</sup> grade through 5<sup>th</sup> grade: Children watch a wordless, highly stylized, animated Bible lesson before interpreting the text through group dialogue, creative exercises, partnered projects, and connecting the story within the actual biblical text. Instead of gliding over the more problematic biblical texts, this curriculum invites children to dive in and search them, ultimately returning to the overarching narrative of God's love for Creation.

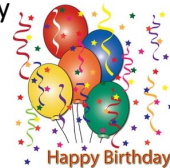
