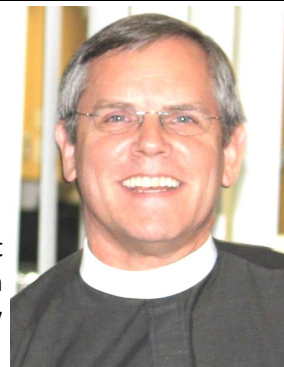

From the Dean's Pen ...

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

We have celebrated two wonderful Sundays with duplicate “Thanksgiving Services” at 9:00AM and 11:00AM as we observed the re-opening of our Cathedral after months of renovation work. What a joyous occasion to be back! ... and to experience the overwhelming response to how bright and welcoming and flexible the space is.



I wish to address the question that has been asked of some members regarding our other service times, specifically, “When will a Saturday and early Sunday Service return to the schedule?” In the context of Covid guidelines that are still in place (*see the article on Guidelines*), we are no longer requiring reservations, but a sign in process is required. If we should have a breakout, we are to be contacting those who were in attendance to quarantine. To do this we need a sign-in volunteer at each of the two entrances. In addition, ushers from the ranks of those attending their service time are necessary for security reasons. One usher is needed from the 5:00PM Saturday worship attendees list since we will only use the east Tower Entrance, and two ushers are needed for the 7:30AM Sunday service as both the North River Entrance and the Tower Entrance are used. At present two volunteers from each of these two service times are willing to make phone calls to fellow worship attendees and determine what volunteers can address these necessary duties: scheduling ushers and sign-in volunteers on a monthly basis.

Gary Fuller will be organizing the Saturday, 5:00PM people. He can be contacted at (775) 750-3727. Betsy Bethke will be reaching out to the Sunday 7:30AM folks. She can be reached at (208) 659-0044.

This criterion is essential before Vestry can approve opening for other service times. There is however, an additional factor. With my being away on sabbatical, we are having to supplement the pulpit with additional supply clergy. This is an additional cost to the budget. It is standard to pay \$350 for a priest to conduct two worship services; preaching and presiding. We have four services a weekend! To get a commitment for doing all four services is not an option with the supply clergy available to us. They are pleased to do two. This is another factor to consider in deciding to add back our 5:00PM Saturday and the 7:30AM services. The desire is for the Vestry to decide during their October meeting, and if possible, start to implement this procedure the month of November.

Peace to Those Who Are Far Off and Peace to Those Who Are Near

On September 11, I attended the installation of Bishop Meghan Rohrer who is the new bishop for the Sierra Pacific Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), and the first transgendered bishop of a mainline denomination in the USA. Because of Covid only 300 people were invited, and since I was one of those who received an invitation I was more than eager to go. The service was a rich mix with a variety of people, traditions, ethnicities and occupations. Particularly prominent was the blend of Lutheran and Episcopal components. The service was held at Grace Episcopal Cathedral in San Francisco, with the Dean of the Cathedral and two Episcopal bishops in attendance. The preacher and installing bishop was the Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, who is married to an Episcopal priest.



Acts 8:26-40, the story of the Ethiopian eunuch, was the second lesson for the service. In her sermon Bishop Eaton connected the experience of the eunuch, who did not fit into any of the normal categories in his time, with the experiences of transgendered persons in our world. The next day, as God would have it, Trinity's Bible and Books group was studying this very passage in *Acts*. I told the group about the service and Bishop Eaton's sermon which emphasized the full inclusion of all people in the Christian Church. When our conversation turned to personal experiences of in-/exclusion, several people said they felt like outsiders in our own faith community. As I thought about this in the following days I got to wondering how many others at Trinity feel like outsiders. We are a diverse mix here, with the vast majority of our people, including the clergy, coming from other Christian traditions. This diversity can enhance our community, but it can also leave some feeling like they exist only on the fringes.

In the *Gospel of Mark*, Jesus focuses his ministry on going to the fringes of his society and restoring the outsiders to their communities. In Ephesians 2:13-14, 17, we read, "But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he . . . has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. . . . So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near." If you are feeling like you don't fit in at Trinity, and so, hang around on the edges, fearing the judgment of the "insiders," please take to heart these words of Scripture and boldly claim your place in the community which is Trinity. We need you more than ever. We have much work to do as we move into our future. No one should be absent from the table.

Dr. Gary Gordon



When I suffered my heart attack on Aug. 29th, it's as if the entire world came to a screeching halt. That week I had been in the midst of moving homes and more than once had complained to friends helping me move that I just didn't feel right. Even though I had been fully vaccinated, we thought perhaps it was a breakthrough covid case, and I arranged for testing. However, when I laid down to rest that afternoon, there was clearly excess fluid in my chest. And as I struggled to breathe, I heard a voice clearly say, "Gary, get up! If you want to live, you must get up!" So, I did. I shared how my legs felt like cement blocks, how I couldn't catch a good breath, and how I had the overwhelming feeling my life was at stake. Next stop was Urgent Care!

Eventually, I'd learn from the doctor's I'd had a series of "silent" heart attacks over the years and I was genetically predisposed, just like my father, who passed of a massive heart attack, when he was just 51.

Now that I've returned to Reno and began the challenging work of healing, the past two weeks have made it very clear that I can't rush the process. Healing must occur in God's time. I am so grateful for the many cards and phone calls I've received from my Trinity family. I'm grateful to the many medical professionals who cared for me both here in Nevada and especially the myriad of smart, young, humble specialists at Stanford. The hospital staff were especially kind and humorous. Additionally, I owe a huge debt of gratitude to Jim Lamb, our senior warden, who ensured I was well taken care of at Stanford and personally transported me back to Reno. The Charlat family has also made getting to doctor's appts, managing medication, making big changes in diet, and so much more possible. Through the love of these folks, my choir family, fellow staff members and clergy, Trinity isn't just a work place. Trinity is family. Thanks be to God and thanks to you all for such a blessing.



Howard Bennett has graciously agreed to step in; plan the service music and play organ on Sunday mornings, and to work with various choir members over the next few weeks. Howard is a God send in so many ways; an "unsung hero". Please accept our thanks Howard for all you do for Trinity and especially for taking on this crucial ministry.

Michael and brother Doug McKeever, and the Foley-Baker Inc. crew did a great job re-installing the organ. Even with unexpected challenges, with some pipes being damaged in transit, they managed to get them repaired, returned to Reno, and everything tuned up for the re-opening service. A herculean effort!

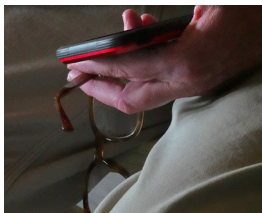

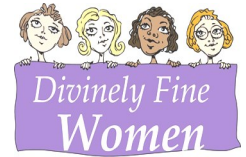

who checks in with you. Every so often, the leader of the group switches the names around, so you have a "new" person to call and you have a "new" person checking in with you.

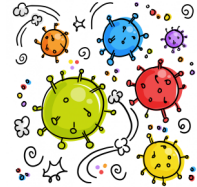

As we have moved back into our Cathedral space, we will be under the same protocols and procedures that have been in practice since we opened for in-person worship in the Parish Hall since the month of May. Additional changes occurred in July as our Governor, CDC, and our Diocesan Office addressed the surge with the Delta variant, that masks must be worn indoors and that we cannot be singing.

Our requirements for worship services and any activity on campus are:

- ♦ **We are wearing masks at all times in-doors.**
- ♦ **Adults and children 12 and older are required to be vaccinated.**
- ♦ **Worshippers must sign in at the door** (A contact list is required. If a break-out case would occur, we would be able to notify attendees of a need to quarantine) .
- ♦ **We are able to handle only 100 worshippers at each service.**



Baptisms to be Celebrated on Sunday, November 7th All Saints Sunday – 11:00AM



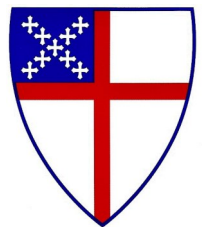

Vestry Minutes Summary—September 21, 2021

The Vestry met using Zoom Meeting. The meeting began with prayer at 6:05PM followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and sharing of blessings.


The September agenda was modified, and the minutes of the August 17, 2021, meeting were approved. **Financial Matters:** David Morgan, Treasurer, reviewed the August 2021 financial statement. He commented that income is almost exactly the same as August 2020. He reported the 2020 audit is ongoing noting it has been 90 days since the process restarted. David reported the Payroll Protection Program loan and accumulated interest has been forgiven and will be reflected in the September financial report. Terry Cain, Junior Warden, reported on the Faith Like a River Budget noting the final construction bills may be close to \$200,000 less than originally budgeted. **Committee Reports:** Finance and Administration Committee. Terry Cain reviewed a proposed draft 2021-2022 budget. Property Committee. Terry reported the exterior video surveillance system is anticipated to be installed in the next few weeks. Building Renovation Committee. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, commented on an electrical wiring issue with the carillon in the belltower. He also reported the exterior signage will be installed in the next few weeks, and we are awaiting more pew cushions to be finished. Terry reported the move back of items from storage into the Cathedral went very smoothly. He noted special thanks to Gary Parks, Harold Campbell, Lindsay Campbell, Ken Heinz, and Juliet Leneaux who were there for the whole move in process. **Dean's Report:** Father William reported the first Sunday worship back in the Cathedral building went very well with approximately 40 people attending the 9AM service and 103 attendees at the 11AM service. He reminded Vestry of the Baptismal service on November 7 and receiving new members on November 14. He also reported he will be attending the consecration of the new Catholic Bishop in a ceremony on September 23 at St. Rose de Lima Catholic Church in Las Vegas. **Old Business:** Vestry approved the revised proposal from HolyCow! Consulting for follow-up work from the recent parish survey. Vestry discussed the issues and potential schedule for adding additional worship services. Father William reported a revised grant request was submitted to the Orvis Foundation. Terry Cain reported the new website is expected to launch soon. John Lilley reported the stewardship team is working on initial plans for the stewardship campaign. Vestry approved moving forward using the TENS programming guidelines from the national church noting full vestry participation in the campaign efforts. **New Business:** Daughters of the King. Carolyn Hoffman reported the DOK is working on the 2021 Angel Tree Project. There are an expected 110 children in this year's program. The initial call to the parish will take place in early November with gifts delivered to the school on December 13. Vestry accepted, with regrets, the resignation of Jeannie Arps as a member of Vestry. The meeting adjourned at 8:22PM. The next Vestry meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 19, 2021, at 6 PM with the venue to be announced.
