From the Dean's Pen ...

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Alleluia! *Amen.*

We are now at a great point of transition in utilizing this month with “getting back” into our Cathedral space after the magnificent renovation (be prepared to be amazed!). On one hand it is a joyous occasion as we re-enter for worship on both September 19th and 26th with two services, 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM. (Before we can add other service times, we need time to learn and use the new sound and light technology as well as how to navigate a rearranged chancel space.) On the 19th at 11:00 AM, we will observe a *Thanksgiving Celebration* in honor of our donors, parish workers and volunteers. On the 26th our *Thanksgiving Celebration*, also at 11:00 AM, will honor our architect, contractor, and sub-contractors. On the other hand, and not the best news, is we are having to continue to adhere to our present covid protocols and guidelines. Nonetheless, it is thrilling to be able to experience the new and renewed space – it’s lighting, spaciousness, freshness, flexibility, new sound, extra restrooms, and of course having the pipe organ putting out joyous music! We will be looking to return our other service times by October if circumstances permit.

With the rise in covid cases with the Delta variant, we may be experiencing a surge in cases, even among those fully vaccinated, at least through October. It is one of the reasons we are postponing a Re-dedication until 2022. We want to truly have a

celebratory Eucharistic service with singing! For the present, masking will be required indoors, social distancing will be observed, and for these four September services we are needing to have an RSVP. Every other pew will be available for seating. Communion will be brought to you in the pew (consecrated host only), and we will simply smile and rejoice that we are able to be back in the space and be with each other!



Because of our present situation with rising cases of covid, we are experiencing a drop in attendance with our present worship in the Parish Hall. There is fear. People are taking responsibility to be safe and cautious, and we as leaders are doing our best to ensure safety. We are and will continue to do virtual worship at 11:00 AM. Many factors like the present covid situation and security issues (do we have ushers at the doors?) are needing to be evaluated. There are a lot of factors still in play, and as we have learned that with each day the situation changes. We do not have a predictable “new normal” yet.

Let us continue to uphold one another in prayer as we rejoice in the progress that has been made and for what opportunities we are privileged to experience! Let us continue to be kind and patient.

From Canon Ruth

Coming Alive with Holy Cow

Many of you recently took the Holy Cow survey, an instrument which the Vestry has chosen in order to get a picture of how Trinity is doing. Taking the survey was hugely popular. 187 of you took it, which is 73% of our average worship attendance. Further, on August 7, several dozen of you showed up on Zoom to hear the results and commentary on the survey. It was a lot of material with much to absorb. As I spoke with various folks after the meeting, we shared how much work needs to be done to make Trinity a more vibrant and effective presence in our community. We spoke of how overwhelming the task seems to be, and because of that, how discouraging it can seem. However, since I knew that many parishes have put the Holy Cow survey instrument to good use, I went looking for a hopeful sign in Trinity's results. So last week I listened to the recording of the August 7 Zoom meeting, taking notes and capturing screen shots. There is still much that I don't completely understand, but one thing struck me as interesting and hopeful and I would like to share that with you.



One of the charts which was shown to us was a bubble chart showing all the activities with which Trinity members are engaged. There were lots of bubbles, all mostly the same size. Our moderator, Robyn Strain, said that that indicated that we have lots of things going on, but because there are so many, our "effort and enthusiasm is consistent, but moderate." Robyn suggested that as a Cathedral we can maximize our impact in the community by focusing on fewer things. She urged us to be "really focused about what you are called to do and highly invest yourselves in something that can really be a dramatic experience for everyone involved." Robyn then showed a quotation by Dr. Howard Thurman: "Don't ask yourself what the world needs. Ask yourself what makes you come alive and then go and do that. Because the world needs people who come alive." What I loved about that is that as recipients of the good news of the gospel, because we have already been made right with God through Christ, our lives are not to be filled with doing the "gotta"s, "should"s and "have to"s. Freed from worrying about how we are doing before God (we are home free!), we are free *for* the neighbor. Free to take our time, look around, see the needs and then put our energies into doing for our neighbors what excites us. There is so much need out there, and we get to choose where to focus. It will feel fun and joyful and not like drudgery.

If you did not take the survey, or did take it but not attend the Zoom meeting, you can still hop on the wagon to find out about it. Email Molly (info@trinityreno.org) and ask her for the Zoom link to watch the recording of the August 7 meeting. If you don't have the capability to watch a Zoom meeting, contact me and we can get you set up in the conference room to watch it. Since the Vestry has committed to seeing this process through, it would be great if the vast majority of Trinity members were familiar with the survey and its results. The conversations will be happening, and we'd love to have many of you at the table.

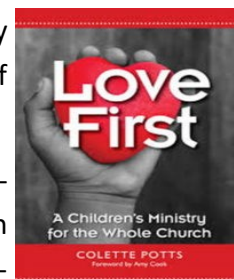

TAKING OUR PULSE SURVEY

Many thanks to all of you who completed the recent parish-wide Taking Our Pulse Survey! We had 187 responses representing 73 percent of our average worship attendance. As noted in the on-line presentation, the results provided an in-depth, data-based overview of where we are as a cathedral. Every church exhibits patterns in its life that contain strengths and potential weaknesses. The survey results indicated Trinity has several areas of strength related to openness and structure of religious practice. Potential weaknesses include a tendency to become tradition-bound and overwhelmed with needs, as well as with the decision-making and governance structures. The survey also invited participants to rank goals for the future.

If you missed HolyCow! Consulting's two-hour presentation to the parish and would like to watch it online, please call the Cathedral office for the link. A more thorough summary will be available in the coming weeks. At its last two meetings, the Vestry discussed how this survey data should not be the end of the conversation and sit on a shelf; rather it is a beginning step of acknowledging and building on strengths while addressing areas of concern and opportunities for improvement. To that end, the Vestry unanimously approved engaging Holy-Cow! for on-site follow-up work involving the clergy, vestry, parishioners, and staff beginning this fall.

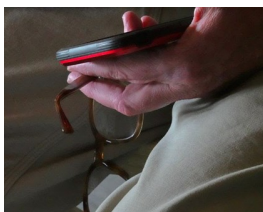
ST. PAUL'S FOOD PANTRY

The renovation work taking place for the past eight months under the direction of Plenum Builders, along with their over 27 sub-contractors and other consultants, is virtually finished. We truly have been blessed to have a great team of leaders from Plenum who worked conscientiously every day to bring us an outstanding project on time and under budget...Thank you, Devin and Jenn. The only activities remaining include going through a punch list to correct any issues, training on new equipment, cleaning of the space, and, oh yes, a Certificate of Occupancy from the city of Reno.

The Cathedral Pipe Organ reinstallation by Foley-Baker from Tolland, Connecticut appears to be finishing earlier than expected. However, and unfortunately, some of the pipes that were sent for special repair to a different company arrived back with some damage. They are on their way back to Ohio for correction and should be installed by September 15 in time for our first service.

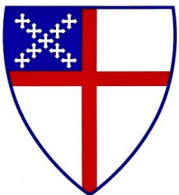
Downstairs in the crypt there is fresh paint and new carpet to welcome back our Sunday School classes and activities. Also, downstairs is an additional new restroom on the east side of the building.

On September 13, O'Brien Storage will return all the boxes and furniture that has been in their safe keeping during the renovation. Our Covid Protocols

As we move back into our Cathedral space, we will still be under the same protocols and procedures that have been in practice since we opened for in-person worship in the Parish Hall in the month of May. Additional changes occurred a few weeks ago as our Governor, CDC, and our Diocesan Office addressed the surge with the Delta variant, that masks must be worn indoors and that we cannot be singing.

As our situation stands, **we are wearing masks at all times in-doors, asking that adults and children over 12 be vaccinated, and requesting folks to make a reservation.** Reservations enable us to keep track of attendance as can only be at 50% occupancy; for the Parish Hall this is 40 worshippers, the Cathedral is 100. Seating will be every other pew for appropriate distancing. Communion (consecrated host only) is delivered to your seat.

The Trinity Endowment Fund was established in 1999 to promote Trinity's mission of proclaiming by work and example the Good News of God and Christ, seeking and serving Christ in all persons and respecting the dignity of every human being.

An endowment is the act of providing money for the continuing support of Trinity with future fiscal needs kept in mind. Donations and gifts to the Endowment fund make up the corpus (principal) of the fund. The Endowment Fund assets are invested in perpetuity, unlike expendable funds which are typically used for immediate needs. This Fund is intended to provide support for the mission and ministry of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral for years to come and will ensure Trinity's future strength and resiliency in the diocese of Nevada and in the Reno/Sparks community.

The Trinity Endowment Fund holdings of \$1,066,897 are invested with The Episcopal Church Foundation. Benefits include low fees, an investment philosophy/style appropriate for church endowments, planned giving assistance and services, professional management-using the largest manager of charitable assets in the world: State Street Global Advisors, and the support in bringing about vibrant, growing Episcopal communities of faith.

Vestry Minutes Summary—August 17, 2021

The Vestry met using Zoom Meeting. The meeting began with prayer at 6:05 PM followed by reading of the Cathedral Mission Statement and sharing of blessings. Dr. Gary Gordon presented the revised Trinity website which will be up and running soon. The August meeting agenda was modified and the minutes of the July 20, 2021, meeting was approved. **Financial Matters:** David Morgan, Treasurer, reviewed the July 2021 financial statement. David provided an update on the progress of the financial audit as well as the filing of the Payroll Protection Program forgiveness application. Vestry discussed plans for the upcoming stewardship campaign. **Committee Reports:** Terry Cain, Junior Warden, reported the Faith Like a River Budget continues on budget as the renovation project nears completion. Vestry approved a contract with ADT Commercial for an external video surveillance system for the Cathedral campus. Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, provided an update on the Cathedral renovation project. With completion of painting and recarpeting in the crypt area, it is anticipated the Cathedral building will be returned to Trinity on September 10. Reinstallation of the pipe organ begins on August 23. **Dean's Report:** Father William provided an update on the opening worship services scheduled for September 19 and September 26. He provided parishioner updates and announced the Reverend John Shoaf will be stepping down as an associate priest due to other job commitments. Father William noted there are five baptisms anticipated for November 7 with confirmations and receiving of new members when the Bishop is present on November 14. He announced rededication service of the Cathedral building is being rescheduled for some time after the first of the year. **Old Business:** In follow-up to the Taking Our Pulse Survey, Vestry approved contracting with HolyCow! Consulting for guidance in moving forward to address concerns identified in the survey. Terry Cain provided Vestry with a schedule for the anticipated move back into the renovated space. Father William reported that Trinity will need to resubmit a new grant request to the Orvis Foundation Board. **New Business:** Information was provided from the Northwest Mission District meeting held on August 15, 2021, at St. Patrick's in Incline Village. Reverend Jeff Paul was elected to the standing committee replacing Reverend Sarah Dunn. The diocesan budget was reviewed. The meeting adjourned at 8:41 PM. The next regular vestry meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 21, 2021, at 6 PM.
