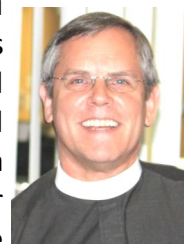
From the Dean's Pen ...

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Cathedral,

Grace and Peace be with you from our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

Some of you may be aware of the fact that Trinity Cathedral is receiving national historic recognition as this has been approved and recommended by both the State of Nevada and the City of Reno. This status will allow us to apply for grant monies to assist with some of the projects that we may now or in the future pursue to help us preserve and maintain The Cathedral. A very large grant for which we were hoping to apply, we discovered, we no longer qualify. Along with that came a second concern, and that was the high cost of the new AC system we were to install.

There is a letter below giving you details in how your vestry and leaders have been working hard to be good stewards of the funds we have raised and searching as best as we can for a product that meets our priorities for accessibility and a fresh and more



open space. Our contractor and architect have been in the thick of all of this with us and support us in working out these details so we may avoid having to have stop-and-start issues with unexpected circumstances (which is inevitably what happens with any construction, but especially with a historic property). We continue to be blessed with a great team of leaders from the community and within our cathedral. We anticipate a real beginning very soon.

Renovation Work with the Cathedral Building: An Update

This message is to update you on progress being made on the renovation of your cathedral. Earlier this year we kicked off the *Faith Like a River* campaign whose first phase was to improve the cathedral's accessibility and to create a more welcoming sanctuary. The initial schedule envisioned vacating the cathedral, relocating its contents, and beginning construction by the first of June. Despite closures and uncertainties associated with the COVID pandemic, we are most grateful for the many volunteers who worked tirelessly to prepare the cathedral in anticipation of this milestone.

However, as with any major construction project, unexpected factors had an impact on this ambitious plan.

The initial construction bid to complete the work as originally conceived was much higher than expected. For example, the design included a state-of-the-art (but ultimately unaffordable) air conditioning system, prohibitively expensive finishes, several custom-made fixtures, and other nice-to-have features. In addition, the cost of removing, storing, and

making needed repairs to the organ was higher than expected. Keeping in mind the paramount importance of being responsible stewards of capital campaign funds, over the past several weeks members of the cathedral's Construction Committee, assisted by the Finance and Administration Committee, closely examined every aspect of the project design and every line of the bid. They worked with the construction company representatives and others to bring the scope of the project within anticipated funding while retaining the twin objectives of accessibility and welcome.

Identifying "must-have" components and prioritizing "nice-to-have" options has been successfully achieved: the original proposed bid was more than \$2.9 million and the Committees have already identified and agreed upon cost savings of approximately \$890,000 with final estimates for a couple of items forthcoming. Moreover, as a result of these

decisions, the schedule for completing this phase can be compressed. Many permits have already been issued by the city, and Dianda Construction is poised to move forward. The Vestry will consider final approval as soon as possible.

While causing some delay in starting construction, the intensive review of the design and costs has ensured good stewardship of the campaign donations entrusted to us, and this will continue throughout the entire project. Trinity Episcopal Cathedral Nominated to Historic Register

The Reno City Council unanimously supported the nomination of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral to the National Register of Historic Places, which is the federal government's official list of historic properties worthy of preservation. This action was approved at its July 22 meeting upon recommendation of the State Historic Preservation Office and the Historical Resources Commission.



As noted in the application, Trinity "is an excellent example of the Late Gothic Revival style, and it is the Reno-Sparks area's only example of a poured concrete church constructed entirely in this style." It notes that the parish has made few substantive physical changes to the exterior of the building and primary interior spaces, retaining its integrity of materials and workmanship. It has not been moved, retaining integrity of location. It continues to convey the sense of

an historic-era, late Gothic Revival style church, retaining its integrity of feeling.

The nomination will now be forwarded to the Keeper of the National Register in Washington, D.C., for review and potential listing in the National Register of Historic Places managed by the National Park Service. Listing the Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in the National Register would provide recognition of the Cathedral's historical importance and would assure protective review of federal projects that might adversely affect the character of the property.

Financial Update

Dear Members of Trinity,

When death robs you of the presence a loved one, the presence of other human beings (and animals) can be a comfort. We gather for funerals or wakes or committals. We seek out public places and companionship because home alone can be just too lonely. We look for grief support groups to share our sorrow and be with other people who “get it.” COVID has robbed us of so many of those opportunities. If you or a friend find yourself in this situation, below are some helps, even though they aren’t in every case the ideal thing we might do in a pandemic-less world.

I have started a zoom grief group (details below). During my years as a hospice chaplain and bereavement coordinator, I facilitated hundreds of grief support groups. Previously they were always in person, but now we only do them via Zoom. I conduct them the same way I did before, which is to say, gently. When we gather, I tell the group that there are only three rules: listen well to each other; be mindful of the number of people present and the time available, so all get a chance to talk; don’t share other’s stories outside this setting. That’s it for rules. Then we go around the room, state our name, who died, about how long ago, and whatever else of sorrows or joyful surprises we each want to share with the group. Without fail, there is always some laughter. Most people say they leave feeling better than when they came. I think what happens is that the participants find a community. Everyone who attends finds that they aren’t alone in their feelings and behaviors, and the others in the group understand on a very deep level what they are going through. I do a little bit of teaching about grief and healing, but mostly the conversation is hearing the stories of the participants. This group is open to the community, including outside of the Reno area.



There are many books and resources out there on the internet, but as with all topics, there’s good stuff and there’s junk. www.hospicewepromise.com is a website which has culled the good stuff and put it all on one site. There are books and articles, a link to a Psychology Today site to help you find a grief counselor or therapist, and tips for children and teens struggling with grief.

Don’t forget that Trinity’s pastoral staff is also available to listen to you and offer some help. Don’t hesitate to call and ask for an appointment. We will keep your confidences.

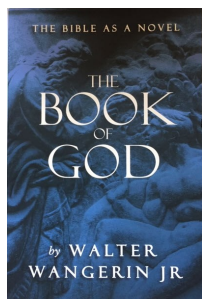

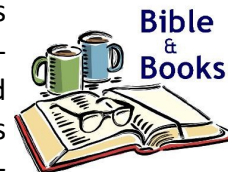
Centering Prayer

Vestry Report

St. Paul's Food Pantry

Vestry Summary, August 17, 2020



Vestry Notes

The meeting was conducted by video conference and opened at 6:07 p.m. with prayer. The agenda (with adjustments) was approved. Minutes of the June 20, 2020 meeting were approved. **Treasurer report:** David Morgan, Treasurer, reported year-to-date income is \$18,050, while anticipated budget deficit was \$11,000. Generally, pledge amounts are holding up. Report was accepted. Terry Caine reported on planning for the 2021 Stewardship Pledge Campaign. The six-week campaign will include recorded interviews discussing various "ministry moments." The **Finance, Facilities, and Administration Committee report:** Jim Lamb, Senior Warden, discussed consideration of formulating a policy establishing guidelines and structures for including registered sex offenders who seek to participate in the parish. In addition, the cathedral must have a formal policy on when background checks should be required. Lynne Charlat, Junior Warden, provided an update on the cathedral renovation. The current delay in starting relates to the redesign of the HVAC system. Lynne also reported the Reno City Council unanimously supported the nomination of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. **Ministry report:** Father William reported the food drop-off continues to go well. He also reported on the changes to the worship and online services and programs. The various adult education programs also are going well. **Vestry:** Father William commended vestry members for continuing to contact parishioners. Vestry agreed to meet in special session on August 19 to further consider a diocesan request. **Administration:** Father William reported the Northwest Mission District will meet via Zoom on August 29 at 10:00 a.m. He also reported the Diocesan Convention is October 9-10 via Zoom. **Old Business:** Father William reported Trinity has been approved for the reduced rate for Microsoft Office 365 software, and the transition to a new technology platform has begun. The meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m. The next regular meeting is scheduled for September 21, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.

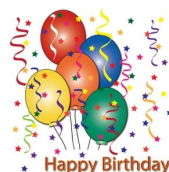
