

At the Worship Service and Celebration we got to see the PBS Reno video that was prepared for the Campaign. It was inspiring and moving, only to be enhanced by what followed – the reveal by the children of the amount of money that has been pledged already for this five year campaign. They revealed one placard at a time to bring us to our total, an amazing amount of \$6,047,923.18! The congregation gasped and were overjoyed as they broke out into an applause that added to the fanfare.

Confession? I thought that was a Catholic Thing.

When asked about private confession in the Episcopal tradition, a bishop is said to have replied, "All may; none must; some should." You

may be surprised to find it right in the Book of Common Prayer on p. 447, except we have, to my mind, a better word for it: *Reconciliation*.

Instead of *confession*, which seems a bit one-sided, *reconciliation* is about bringing balance back to our lives. Reconciliation isn't only about our shortcomings, but also about voicing aloud our worries, our fears, our longings — whatever it takes to bring your life into balance. It can be very powerful to speak all these thoughts aloud to another

Christian and then receive absolution... absolution for our shortcomings... absolution that acknowledges we are simply human. What you say, the priest holds in private as a sacred trust.

The most amazing absolution I ever received was (believe it or not) from my veterinarian of many years. When I was eighteen, I had a cat who broke her leg. I spent more than I had on casting and pins, but nothing worked. Finally, the vet said the only way to solve it was to amputate. I was horrified at the thought of maiming an animal; I chose instead to have the cat put to sleep. As I have since learned, animals do fine with an amputation — humans are the ones who have a problem with it. I have felt guilty about this choice ever since. When I took my cat in for her check-up this last summer I told my vet this story. He looked thoughtful, and then said, "I'm not sure it's fair to judge ourselves by who we were years ago. We grow and learn." When he said these words, my eyes teared up, and I felt a load lifted off me I didn't even know I had been carrying all these years. I replied, "Thank you. I've been a priest for a lot of years, and I know absolution when I hear it."

So what burdens are you carrying? Reconciliation is available to all at any time from one of the priests, but on Ash Wednesday (March 1) and Good Friday (April 10), our priests will be sitting throughout the congregation after the services so you can approach them and ask for Reconciliation. All may; none must... but, especially if you're carrying a heavy burden... you really should.

Trinity is helping the Homeless in February!

Every day more of our Trinity families and neighbors find their backs up against the wall. Rent is skyrocketing. Thousands are stuck in weekly motels. Homelessness is on the rise. The status quo is literally killing people. While feeding the poor is something we do regularly at Trinity Cathedral, we need to do more to reach the roots of homelessness in our community.



Here are some things you can do this winter to be part of the solution:

Eucharistic Ministers' Day to Review and Train

Saturday, February 8th, we will meet in the church at 9:30 AM to review our work as Eucharistic Ministers. ALL Eucharistic Ministers serving at any of the four Services must be in attendance. Our Eucharistic Ministers are licensed by the diocese and are required to have taken a discipleship course (like Episcopal 101), completed the on-line "Safe Guarding God's Children" work (see Fr. Rick for login info and passwords), and been trained by the Rector. An annual review is



important and your name is submitted to the Diocese with the Rector's approval for licensing. The license is good for five years.

To be scheduled to serve this training and workshop is important. Scheduling is now done by our Deacon, Rev. Patsy Pumphrey. If you are unable to attend please let Rev. Patsy or Fr. William know.

Ash Wednesday, February 26, we will have three services with Eucharist and the imposition of Ashes: 7:30 AM; 12:10 Noon, and; 6:00 PM. This is the first of the forty days of Lent, named for the custom of placing blessed ashes on the foreheads of worshipers at Ash Wednesday services. The ashes are a sign of penitence and a reminder of mortality, and are imposed with the sign of the cross. Private Confession will be available with any of the attending clergy after each service.

January Vestry Summary

Our meeting began after our dinner at 5:30 PM and at 6:00 with our candle lighting, opening prayer, and Bible study led by Gretchen Wolfe on a comparison of the Gospels. The agenda (with the addition of an update on the Bishop Search process), December Minutes, and Finance Reports were approved. The Treasurer reported that with a deficit 2019 budget of \$60K, we did end up in the black with \$3K in surplus. In regard to the Annual Pledge program, "Growing God's Love" for 2020, we have 219 pledgers and a pledged amount of \$600,033. We will have a Ministry Moment in February to do a final report of the Annual Pledge results. The Endowment Board had discussion in regard to investment strategies of 60 % equities and 40% fixed investments. Our balance is now about \$925,000,000 in the Endowment. The FFA Committee Report: The members of the Fund Raising Cabinet were complimented for their work in raising pledges of \$6M for the Capital Campaign. There has been 100% participation from the Vestry and new vestry members along with the campaign leaders. This week the Campaign Letters are being mailed to the membership; booklets will be available to pick up at worship. We would like to end the pledge process with Easter Sunday. The 2020 Budget was presented and discussed. The goal of \$635K and not to exceed a deficit of more than \$65K are the parameters for this 2020 year. This will be our third year operating with a deficit budget. The increase in the budget is due to increased stipends for adjunct priests and the anticipated Music Director salary. Ministry Report has Lenten prayer (Taizé), programs and study being prepared. Property Committee reported on security issues with homeless sleeping on the property and some vandalism. The Dean reported that the ecumenical pulpit exchange is this Sunday, January 26 with the 11:00 Service. Father William will be at Good Shepherd; Rev. Khris Marshall from First United Methodist will be with Trinity. The Annual Bishop's Clergy Conference will not be at Galilee but here at the Cathedral on April 30—May 1. Fr. William expressed his gratitude for the excellent service and program with the Capital Campaign launch on Sunday, Jan. 19th. Vestry Report: Diocesan Convention will be October 8-9 in Las Vegas this year and our list of delegates and alternates will be completed at the Annual Meeting this coming Sunday, Jan. 26th. The Vestry will be planning a strategic planning retreat on Saturday, March 14th. Administration Reports: The Musician Search Committee states that at present there are 35 applicants with the announcement closing on January 31st. The committee has regular meetings and are screening and documenting the applicants' credentials. Old and New Business: We talked about our funeral guidelines and will be removing a facility use fee for active members. Discussion will be held later once information is gathered about raising the columbarium costs. We are in need of individuals who would like to work as a funeral/wedding host or hostess on behalf of Trinity. We also approved a vacation holiday schedule for the 2020 year. The Cassavant Organ proposal for moving the pipes will not be done; the cost is prohibitive and the organ is in excellent shape. The Bishop Search Committee meets in Las Vegas on Jan. 31—Feb. 1. Next Meeting is Monday, February 24th.
