At each step, we have prayed for God's guidance and strength. Your commitment to Trinity's mission, your daily volunteer service and your generous giving continues to buoy our spirits and keep our faith flowing like a mighty river as we move closer and closer to our \$7 million goal.

I am filled with personal great joy and appreciation for each of you and look forward to the shared journey of faith and witness that we are joyously undertaking!

A New Year's Resolution: Be more like the birds

THE REV. CANON RICK MILLSAP, ASSOCIATE PRIEST FOR PASTORAL CARE & PARISH LIFE National Bird Day is celebrated January 5th. Bird Day is the oldest of the days set aside to recognize birds. According to the U.S. Library of Congress, Bird Day was first observed on May 4, 1894.

I have often wondered where the phrase "for the birds" came from. We say things like, "My day at work was for the birds," when we mean it was crazy or pointless. It seems an unfair speciesist slur on our feathered neighbors. They seem very organized and hard workers to me. The first up at daybreak are the tiny

wrens, then the mourning doves, followed by the larger birds... quail, pigeons (who like to sleep in later), robins, blue jays, and yellow-eyed grackles. The last to bed are the wrens again. They scour the ground for seed until the final light is gone in the evening.

I have a lot of theories about birds. Some of them are simple, and some of them are rather odd.



One of the simple theories is I think they appreciate that I feed them. They seem to know me when I come out with their seed, and I interpret their songs as gratitude. This is in contrast to my cat for whom a good meal served on time is simply her due. Then, of course, I have some weirder theories. It is possible that birds control the traffic lights. Have you noticed how they perch on traffic lights at every intersection. I seem to notice the quality and quantity of the seed I set out directly affects the number of green lights I get. If you want a really smooth drive home, try setting out peanut butter suet too. I may be wrong... you might want to check this by doing your own experiment.

Jesus was a bird watcher too. In Matthew 6:26, Jesus said, "Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?"

Maybe our lives this new year would be a little better if we were more like the birds. If we could go into this new adventure we call 2020 with just a little more trust that the God of the universe is going to supply all our needs... physical, emotional, spiritual. We will be loved. We will be safe. Like the birds, if we could walk through our days with a little more gratitude for everything — the good and the bad — maybe then, God would be able to calm down all our frantic flutterings, as he holds us gently in his hands.

In January, we are reading, Tired of Apologizing for a Church I Don't Belong To: Spirituality without Stereotypes, Religion without Ranting by Lillian Daniel.

From Amazon: "When Lillian Daniel apologized to a total stranger for every bad thing that had ever been said or done in

the name of Christianity, he was surprised that she was responsible for all that. 'The Inquisition? Don't even raise it, I'm way ahead of you. I was mad about it before you even heard of it, that's how open-minded I am. Salem witch trials? I know! So embarrassing. Can I hang out with you anyway? You're too kind.' 'Religion is responsible for all the wars in history,' they would say, and I'd respond, 'You're so right. Don't forget imperialism, capitalism, and racism. Religion invented those problems

too. You can tell that because religious people can be found at all their meetings.' In this book, Daniel argues it's time for Christians to stop apologizing and realize how we talk about Christian community matters. With disarming candor laced with just the right amount of humor, Daniel urges open-minded Christians to explore ways to talk about their faith journeys that are reasonable, rigorous, and real."

Musician Search Committee Update



As of December 12, the committee received 25 organist/choir master applications. We are extremely excited that many of these potential candidates have extensive qualifications, broad experience and diversity to further develop and expand the music ministry of the Cathedral. The window to submit applications closes on January 31. In early January, the committee will begin evaluating resumes and other supporting information to narrow the potential candidate list. Once the application window closes and all received applications are reviewed and evaluated, the next step involves personal contact with candidates to gain better knowledge of the philosophy and personality of potential final candidates. Ultimately, the committee will narrow the candidate list to three finalists. The vetting process includes inviting the finalists to Reno in March or April during which they will be asked to take part in a choir rehearsal, perform a Pipes on the River concert, and participate in a Sunday Mass. 



December Vestry Summary

Our meeting began after our dinner at 6:00 PM with our candle lighting, opening prayer, and bible study led by Father William from the Advent –Dicken's Christmas Story devotional. The agenda, November Minutes, and finance reports were approved. A decision was made to create a separate "Interest Unallocated Account" to hold the interest being accrued by the pre-paid Capital Campaign contributions. In regard to the Annual Pledge program, 200 pledges have been received to date. We are hopeful we will meet our goal and have December and early January to see where we will stand. The FFA Committee reports that the Capital Campaign launce and event will take place n January 19th. KNPR has prepared a special video for us. Ministry Reports: Angel tree was a huge success. They have an access of funds to seed the program fro 2020. The Flower Guild requested an increase in cost for the flower vases on Sundays to \$50 per vase and the Vestry approved this increase. The Vestry also approved a recommendation that members of the Bible and Book classes will be asked to provide their own reading material and Trinity will provide several loaner books for those who need them in order to ease the work reconciling the purchases related to books for the Adult Bible Study classes. The Dean's Report shared that there will be an ecumenical pulpit exchange on Sunday, January 26 with the 11:00 Service. Father William will be at Good Shepherd; Rev. Kris Marshall from First United Methodist will be with Trinity. The Bishop's Visit with December 7th and the three adult Confirmations was a huge success. The Vestry Nomination Committee have put forth the four candidates for Vestry and they were approved. They will be formally voted on by the congregation at the annual meeting of January 26th. They are Jeannie Arps, Terrie Cain, Cleta Dillard, and Margaret Zuccarini. Nominations for Convention delegates and Alternates are being pursued. With Administration Reports, the Musician Search Committee 25 applicants with varying credentials and education. In January the committee will meet weekly to begin to sort and categorize the applicants. We are taking applications till the end of January. Teleconferencing will be the initial interview process; final candidates will be brought in to accompany a worship service, lead the choir, and do a recital. A great deal of conversation took place in regard to establishing a Music Guild which we will place volunteers in supporting roles for the music program for the interim period. Our new musician will determine whether to continue this Guild upon joining the cathedral staff. The Funeral Guidelines were discussed; they have not been updated since Father William's ministry began. He recommends that we remove a facility use fee for members (those on our active membership rolls). Also the Finance Committee recommends that we evaluate raising the cost of the columbarium niches. The January 19th Capital Campaign special event will be exploring parking options for congregants, especially from the courthouse lot. Vestry discussed the City Council's dealing with the Shading Ordinance and its defeat and the debacle of our unfortunate dealings with the developer. The Vestry approved Rev. Mikayla attending an Education Conference hosted by Forma in Atlanta, GA. in January. Vestry's next meeting will be January 20th.
